



Platinum Performance Hunter Horse of the Week

Awarded to the horse each week who wins either the USHJA National Hunter Derby or USHJA International Hunter Derby when offered.

Riders Boutique Leading Equitation Rider

Award to be presented during the American Gold Cup held on September 17-21, 2025 at the Flintfields Horse Park.

A Butet Practice Saddle will be awarded to the Leading Equitation Rider who accumulates the most points in competitions held in all Traverse City Horse Shows in 2025.

Classes to count include: **11 & Under Equitation** 4026, 4027, 4028; **Riders Boutique 12 - 14 Years Equitation** 4031, 4032, 4033 and **15-17 Years Equitation** 4041, 4042, 4043 from the (4) Traverse City Spring Shows, (6) Great Lakes Equestrian Festival and the (3) Tournament of Champions fall competitions to count.

It is requested that the leading rider be present to receive the award.


Points awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th place from the following classes:

Ribbons won in Over Fence classes to count: winner gets 12 points, 2nd gets 10, 3rd gets 9, 4th gets 5, 5th gets 4, 6th gets 3, 7th gets 2, 8th gets 1 Ribbons won in Under Saddle classes to count: winner gets 10 points, 2nd gets 8, 3rd gets 6, 4th gets 5, 5th gets 4, 6th gets 3, 7th gets 2, 8th gets 1.

\$5,000 Leading Amateur Hunter & \$5,000 Leading Junior Hunter Rider Award and Bonus presented by Makoto Farm, Hunters Edge & Crooked Willow Farm

The \$5,000 Leading Amateur Hunter Rider and the \$5,000 Leading Junior Hunter Rider Award and Bonus shall be presented during Week 4 of the Great Lakes Equestrian Festival to the Junior and Amateur rider and horse combinations that accumulates the most points in the USHJA National Hunter Derbies and the USHJA National Junior/Amateur Hunter Derbies during Traverse City Spring Series Weeks 1 - 4, and the Great Lakes Equestrian Festival Weeks 1 - 4. If a horse and rider combination enter both the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA Junior/Amateur Hunter Derby in the same week, only the points earned from their highest placing in one class shall count. In the event of a tie, the bonus shall be split equally. It is requested that the Leading Rider be present to receive the award.

Points shall be awarded as follows: 1st - 8 points, 2nd - 6 points, 3rd - 4 points, 4th - 3 points, 5th - 2 points, 6th - 1 point.

NOMINATION FEE: \$250

ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible for the Jumper Division horses must be nominated and the nominating fee of \$250 paid by the closing date of entries. Horses

nominated after that date must pay a nominating fee of \$290. Once a horse is nominated, he becomes eligible to compete in the following sections:

Open Jumper, 1,45m 1.40m, Amateur Jumper, Junior Jumper and all special classes held in the Jumper Division, if otherwise eligible.

RECORDING: The Federation maintains records of winnings in classes at licensed competitions. Jumpers must be recorded with the Federation in order to

receive points towards any USEF or USHJA Zone or Horse of the Year awards. Any change of a recorded horses's name and/or ownership must

be recorded with Federation in accordance with GR1105 and GR 1107.

TIES: Horses tied for other than first place will be placed based on their time in the first round, unless otherwise stated.

DECLARATIONS: Horses must be declared for their class no later than 4:00 p.m. the day before the class is to be held, except where otherwise stated.

START ORDER: Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule JP 112.

OTHER: Schooling, Tack & Equipment, Conduct & Attire - According to the General Regulations and USEF Rules except where otherwise noted.

USEF Tables for classes under \$25,000 may be changed based on entries (Table II, 2.1, Table II, 2(a), Table II, 2(b), Table II, 2(c), 2(d)







HUNTER DIVISION

Hunter sections may be run as back-to-back classes at management's discretion (HU125). When classes are run back-to-back, exhibitors may perform both rounds before leaving the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise indicated. Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule HU126. Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, panels. Individual hunter classes may be entered for 20% of the prize money offered in that class unless otherwise specified.

In all rated hunter sections a numerical score will be given by the judges.

In all classes over obstacles, all horses being considered for an award must jog for soundness using either Option A or Option B below. Management to decide which method of jogging will be used prior to the start of each competition week. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge's decision regarding soundness is final.

Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.

Option B: Horses/ponies will be jogged together with the rider unmounted in the judge's order of preference. Two additional entries in addition to the number of ribbons must jog if there are sufficient entries. Horses/ponies may be asked to re-jog at the judge's discretion. A horse/pony may not leave the ring until the job has been declared official by the judge, or it will be eliminated. A horse that is unruly, one that breaks away from the handler or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, handler, other exhibitors or their entries will be eliminated. (Exception: Hunter Breeding and Pony Breeding). A horse may not be eliminated for receiving outside assistance in the jog. In classes restricted to ponies a junior must jog the pony for soundness.

All sections that may be combined will be done 24 hours prior to the division start.



No horse may compete in this section unless the owner possesses a current Measurement Card or Certified Card or copy of a valid measurement form issued by USEF. No rider may show more than three ponies in any one height section. Junior riders showing ponies cannot compete in any class where fences may be set higher than 3'6" at the same competition (Exception children's Jumpers, Green Pony Hunters and Pony Jumpers).

Ponies shown by adults at a Recognized competition cannot compete in any rated Pony Hunter sections at the same competition with a junior rider.

In classes over fences small ponies not ponies are not to exceed 12.2 hands to jump 2'3"; medium ponies over 12.2 and not exceeding 13.2 hands to jump 2'6"; large ponies over 13.2 and not exceeding 14.2 hands to jump 3'.

Manners of the pony and suitability of the pony to the rider must be emphasized in all classes. Extreme speed must be penalized. Suitability of a pony for a rider is determined by height of rider as related to the height of the pony. Judges must penalize but not necessarily eliminate an entry not having such suitability and manners. 

- 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of eight feet on its front face.
- 6. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
- 7. Fence heights: 2'6"
- B. Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)
 - 1. A minimum of nine obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
 - 2. At least one bending line.
 - 3. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
 - 4. At least one long approach.
- C. Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)
 - 1. A minimum of seven obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.
 - 2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'0" in height, halt and/or back. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
 - 3. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 from the first round are eligible to return for the second round.

Tie Breaking Procedures

- A. No panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score of that round.
- C. Twelve (12) entries are to return for the second round, only the top twelve (12) horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
- D. In the event of a ties for the overall standings, the tie will be broken using the second round base score.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs - may be split into three (3) sections

Cross Entry Riders: Riders entered in Adult Amateur Hunter sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (exception: Equitation, Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Amateur Owner Hunter, Amateur Owner Jumper classes, and the USHJA International Hunter Derby). CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Sections offered and requirements: Small/Medium Children's Pony, Large Children's Pony

Prize Money: No minimum prize money is required.

Cross Entry: Rider:

Age restrictions in the regular pony sections do not apply. Riders may only show one children's pony when showing multiple ponies in the Regular or Green Pony Sections. Or if a rider is showing multiple ponies in the children's pony section then they can only show one pony in the Regular or Green Pony Section.

Horse and Rider Combination:

The same pony/rider combination may not show in the green or Regular pony Section at the same show. Fence Height: Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0" with spreads not to exceed height of fence; Large Ponies: 2'6" with spreads not to exceed height of fence. • In and outs will not be permitted

• Distances for this section should be set on the 12-foot stride.

Combining/Dividing Sections: Children's Hunter Pony sections may be combined with Children's Hunter Horse sections if there are fewer than four (4) entries in a section. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. The Children's Hunter Pony may be divided by height (small/medium and large). If there are four (4) or more entries in each height section, the sections must be held separately.

Suggested Distances: At management's discretion, Children's Hunter Pony may choose to run the section as follows using the suggested distance guidelines:

a. 2'0" Small Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on 9'9"stride): 4 strides at 48'9"; 5 strides at 58'6"; 6 strides at 68'3"; 7 strides at 78'8"; 8 strides at 87'9".

b. 2'3" Medium Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on a 10'3" stride): 4 strides at 51'3"; 5 strides at 61'6"; 6 strides at 71'9"; 7 strides at 82'; 8 strides at 92'3".

c. 2'6" Large Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on an 11' stride): 4 strides at 55'; 5 strides at 66'; 6 strides at 77'; 7 strides at 88'; 8 strides at 99'.

JUNIOR JUMPER

Sections offered and Requirements: • 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper • 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper

Cross Entry: Rider: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumpers riders may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m at the same competition.

1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper riders may not cross enter into High Junior classes or any other jumper class exceeding 1.30m at the same competition with the exception of classes which do not offer prize money (including add back money) see HU141 and HU137 for cross entry restrictions.

Horse/Pony No cross entry restrictions

Horse and Rider Combination: 1.00/1.05m Junior horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumpers at the same competition. 1.10/1.15m Junior horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumpers at the same competition.

Fence Height: • Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m • Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Junior's with Adult Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section:

• 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper section • 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper section

Guidelines for Combining and Dividing Hunter Sections

Performance Hunter and High Performance Hunter.

a. Number to hold separate sections: Performance: four (4) and High Performance three (3). If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.

- 1. At all licensed competitions, if there are fewer than four entries in either the Performance Hunter 3'3" or Performance Hunter 3'6" they must be combined. but they cannot be combined with any other Hunter sections, except High Performance Hunter. If there are four or more entries in each Performance Hunter section, they must be held separately. If the Performance Hunter 3' 6" and the Performance Hunter 3'3" sections have fewer than three entries after they have been combined they may be further combined with the High Performance Hunter
- 2. If there are fewer than three entries in the High Performance Hunter section it must first be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section or the Green Hunter 3'9" section (or with Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" if offered combined). If the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section it may then further be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'3" section, but may not be combined with the Green Hunter section(s).
- When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter section the following applies:
 a. When combining High Performance Hunter with Performance Hunters, the
- combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Performance Hunter section(s) with which it is combined.
- b. When combining High Performance Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry
- 4. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:
- a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section
- b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must be combined with High Performance Working Hunter.
- c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section.
- d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.
- e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6". Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section
- The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections.
- c. Dividing:
- In Performance Hunter, High Performance Hunter and any other sections where individual classes may be entered, the sections may only be divided after thirty (30) horses have competed in the first over fences class. Subsequent classes may be divided once twelve (12) horses have competed in each class. For Championships, see HU154.

Green Hunter

- a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3).
- 1. Green Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other hunter section(s) (Exception; The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" and 3'9" sections, see HU164.1)
- 2. Regardless of competition rating, each Green Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries.

 3. If there are fewer than three entries in a Green Hunter section, that section
- must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter. 4 If after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter
- 5. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two noncontiguous fence height sections may be combined.
- 6. If Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'0" and/or 3'3" sections are combined with Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and/or Green Hunter 3'9" sections a Handy Hunter class is not required. The combined sections must meet class number requirements for Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and Green Hunter 3'9" and use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees. 7. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:
- a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section.
- b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must
- be combined with High Performance Working Hunter. c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section
- d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and
- e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section.
- f. The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections
- c. Dividina:

1. Regardless of competition rating, any Green Hunter section that is offered combined must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or as one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections

- a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3). b. Combining:
 1. Young Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other Hunter section. 2. At Competition Management's discretion, and with at least three (3) Young Hunters entered in any section, the Young Hunter Section(s) may run concurrently with the corresponding Green Hunter height section or Combined Green Hunter Section. Horses that are entered in both the Young Hunter and Green Hunter section(s) will be eligible for awards in both sections. Horses that are not entered in both sections will only be eligible for awards in the section in which they are entered. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in any of the Young Hunter section(s) they must be combined for awards per HU166.3. A separate entry fee for the Young Hunter Section will apply. The Green Hunter section requirements by rating listed in HU166.2 will still apply.
- Regardless of competition rating, each Young Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in a Young Hunter section that section must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiquous fence height sections those two non-contiguous fence height sections may be combined.
- c. Dividing:

 1. Regardless of competition rating, any Young Hunter section that is offered as a combined section must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections.

Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" and High Performance Conformation Hunter a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3).

b. Combining:

- 1. The Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" may only be combined with the High Performance Conformation Hunter. The High Performance Conformation Hunter may only be combined with the Green Conformation Hunter 3'6".
- 2. When offered as two sections, if there are fewer than three (3) horses in either the Green Conformation 3'6" or the High Performance Conformation section they must be combined.
- 3. When combining Green Conformation Hunter with High Performance Conformation Hunter, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined section will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.
- c. Dividing: If there are three (3) or more horses in each Conformation section they must be held separately.

Junior Hunter

- a. Number to hold separate sections: four (4) in each section. If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.
- The Junior Hunter 3'6". Junior Hunter 3'3". Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6". and Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3" sections may only be combined with other Junior Hunter or Amateur Owner Hunter sections. See below for conditions.
- 2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, Competition Management may choose to combine the sections. The Competition Management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ122). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count.
- 3. It is recommended that when competitions anticipate 50 horses or more this section be divided by age of rider or height of horse when prize list is prepared.
- When divided, sections must be split using one of the methods from HU161 Methods of Dividing.
- If there are 50 or more entries in the section at the beginning of the first class it must be divided and the prize money must be doubled
- 3. If there are 50 or more entries remaining in a section after it has been divided, the section must be redivided and the prize money must be doubled. Once a section has been redivided it may be divided further if management so desires. 4. If the Junior Hunter sections are divided by height of animal, they must be divided into Large and Small. Premier rated Junior Hunter 3'6" sections at Premier rated competitions must be offered as four sections (large/vounger, large/older, small/ younger, small/older).
- 5. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in any sections divided by age and/or height of animal, those sections must be combined with other sections. If there is a minimum of twelve (12) entries once any sections have been combined, the newly combined section must be redivided.

a. Number to hold separate sections: four (4) in each section. If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.

b. Combining:

- 1. The Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6", Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3", Junior Hunter 3'6", and Junior Hunter
- 3'3" sections may only be combined with other Amateur Owner Hunter or Junior Hunter sections
- See below for conditions.
- 2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3" the Amateur Owner 3'6" the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, competition management may choose to combine the sections. The competition management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ121). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count. 3. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, these sections may be combined. The competition management may choose to combine the classes as necessary. based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered c. Dividing:
- 1. Amateur Owner 3'6" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either divided section. they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be redivided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU162 & HU160 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on the entry blank.
- When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number. 2. Amateur Owner 3'3" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either divided section, they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be re-divided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU164 & HU162 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on entry blank. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

- 1. The Regular Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections. 2. Height sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) in any height

- 2. If there are 50 or more entries in the division at the beginning of the first class.

Green Pony Hunter

If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); prize money need not be doubled. If there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled

 a. Competitions must offer Adult Amateur Hunter sections in accordance with the specifications of each USHJA Zone.

 b. Notice of the use of a floating split and the age groups must be posted at the competition office. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. Age must be given on entry blank. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

Children's Huntera. Children's Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications

Low Adult Hunter a. Low Adult Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETI-TIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, OR AGENT, AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETI-TIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF IN-TRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HAN-**DLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES**

Federation Entry Agreement - By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right to publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchip HU104: As of December 1, 2017, all horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration **must provide a microchip number** that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered.

A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in thenuchal ligament of the animal.

This rule will have a transition period from December 1, 2017 to November 30, 2018. During this period, animals that are not in compliance with this rule will not receive points or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards. After this period, all horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions. Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

2. ENTRIES:

- a) Entries open immediately upon publication of this prize list.
- b) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC requires that nomination fees, hunter, equitation fees, stabling fee, and USEF Drug & Admin fee, EMT/HEART Ambulance Fee \$30, Nightwatch fee \$20 per horse per show & a non refundable Office Processing Fee \$90 accompany each entry blank.

Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to the **Traverse City Horse Shows**, **LLC** in United States funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed.

3. ENTRIES & NOMINATIONS

- Entries after the closing date May 30 will be accepted with a late fee of \$100 per horse.
 - Entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion. A post entry late charge of \$40 per class or \$80 per hunter section will apply after the closing date of entries.
- b) Nominations for all noted non FEI Jumper Sections \$250. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$40 unless otherwise stated.
- c) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (see Rule No. 15) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 pm the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes.
- d) Late or improper Grand Prix/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 \$35,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 will be assessed without exception. In the event of acceptance of a later declaration where Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- Horses competing in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- f) NIGHT WATCH: All horses occupying a stall, whether showing or not, are required to pay a one time per show NightWatch fee of \$20 per show. This service is NOT OPTIONAL. Horses will be checked 6 times each night beginning at 7pm on Monday through 6am the following Monday. Please provide emergency contact name and cell phone or hotel room and phone number at your stalls.
- Each entry form must give the owner, rider, trainer, and horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider and trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers
- h) USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$8 Drug & Medication, \$15 USEF) (FEI horses \$33 fee) and a \$10 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their USEF/ USHJA membership card to the Competition Secretary. Failure to present a USEF card will result in having to pay non-member fees. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card must be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced.
- i) USEF Eligibility/ USHJA Show Pass Fees:

USEF Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.

Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.

To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.

The eligibility requirement for foreign participants went into effect on September 1, 2023, and under this requirement, foreign participants are no longer permitted to participate in USEF national competitions by merely demonstrating good standing with their own National Federation. A few important notes on this:

- Foreign Participants will now be required to join USEF as Competing Members.
- Those individuals 18 years of age and older must take SafeSport Training to be eligible to participate in USEF national competitions.
- For those participating in FEI events only, this requirement does not apply.
- This requirement has been in effect since September 1, 2023, for all foreign competitors except Equestrian Canada competitors.

The online Show Pass form will be available on the USEF website and can be accessed at the following URL: https://www.usef.org/show-pass The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.

- USHJA Show Pass fee for non members of the USHJA \$30 per competition.
- j) USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix are subject to USEF International High Performance fee. A \$35 per horse fee will be accessed for each horse on a per class basis.
- k) The responsible party as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions; management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on USEF National Horse of The Year points earned from December 1, 2023 to November 30, 2024. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries.
- m) A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks.
 Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.
- n) Non competing horses will be charged a fee of \$150 per week.
- All horses are required to wear a back number when leaving the stables and on the competition grounds.

4. SCRATCHES:

- a) Horses entered in hunter sections, classes or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$125 per jumper or \$100 per hunter. The Office Processing Fee is non refundable.
 - Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary prior to the start of the class or classes being scratched. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition.
- b) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- c) \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the competition, an Official Veterinarian's Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any class at the competition, no refund of the nominating fee will be given.
- HUNTER SCORING: The open numerical hunter scoring system will be used at the discretion of Management.
- COURTESY CIRCLE: Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes in accordance with USEF rules.
- HORS CONCOURS: No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concurs' during the competition.
- COMPETITION RING ACCESS: Flatting will be allowed in all rings except the Grand Prix ring up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the first class. Weather permitting. Unless otherwise noted.
- NUMBERS: Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.

10. ATTIRE:

- a) Appropriate dress is required in all classes.
- b) Formal attire: JUMPERS: Scarlet, dark blue, dark green or black coat; white shirt with white tie, white choker or white stock; white, fawn, or canary breeches, protective headgear See GR 801, black or brown boots. No exceptions.
- c) Formal attire: HUNTERS: Riders are required to wear scarlet dark coats; white shirts with white stock; white, buff or canary breeches and hunting cap, derby, hunting silk hat, or protective headgear. See GR 801, HU128 and EQ105.1&2
- Jumper riders may wear breeches and solid colored polo shirts unless otherwise noted.

 ALL exhibitors must wear properly fitted protective headgear with a chin strap that passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards while riding on the competition grounds. (USEF GR 801.2)

11. AWARD CEREMONIES:

Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Team competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present will result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class.

12. ORDERS OF GO: Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU 159. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that the necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over three minutes due to conflicts.

13. STABLING:

- Traverse City Horse Shows LLC have the right to permit horses to come and go at will. We have elected to do so within certain guidelines upholding our no poling policy.
- b) Weekly Stalls 10'x10',will be temporary housed under canvas and stall doors will be provided at a fee of \$395 per stall tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries. Stall mats included.

Permanent National Weekly Stalls (Limited Availability) 10x12 housed under hard cover with doors and mats provided, will be provided at a fee of \$500 per stall tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries.

FEI stalls 10'x12', - extra tack stalls will be provided at a fee of \$500 per stall tax included for each FEI competition. Stalls must be reserved by the closing date of entries. Stall mats included.

A charge of \$25 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date of entries. Layover stabling \$45/day.

- No trailering in or working off trailers will be allowed.
- d) Grounds Fee: \$50 will be assessed to horses who are hacking onto the grounds for any reason. Back numbers must be obtained from the show office and worn at all times.
- e) Initial bedding will not be provided.
- f) Unless special arrangements are made with management, stalls must be vacated no later than 8:00am the day following the conclusion of each competition.
- g) STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES
- Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done to their stalls, intentionally or not, and will be charged accordingly.
- i) Stable flooring is a limestone base.
- Horses are not allowed to share a stall during the competition week. Show accounts may only have a whole stall applied. No splits for the week.
- 14. COURSES: In all jumper classes, courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, rails, planks, water, liverpool, ditch, wall and panels. In all hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as; brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank and panels.
- 15. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS: Competition days Open one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 4:00 pm whichever is later. Non-Competition Day hours will be from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm.
- 16. ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT: All accounts must be settled in full no later than 4:00 pm on the last day of each scheduled competition. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the grounds, a release must be obtained from the Competition Secretary. If you are providing barn splits to the office please note there can be no sharing of a stall on accounts for the week. The office is unable to split stalls into fractions.

17. PRIZE MONEY:

- a) All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form in order to receive prize money. Prize money will be credited to entry show account. IRS 1099 Miscellaneous Income Forms will be issued to the payee as listed on the entry form.
- Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.
- c) Prize Money will be credited to the horse account and any remaining credit balance will be mailed within 30 days of completion of show.
- 18. FEED & BEDDING: Provided by the 'Official Feed Store' of the Traverse City Horse Shows & Flintfields Entertainment LLC. In order to assure exhibitors of an adequate supply of feed based on fair market prices, no other feed vendor other than the Official Feed Store will be permitted on the grounds without the express permission of the Management. email: feed.glef@gmail.com
- 19. DOGS: All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the show

grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.

- 20. OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers must be credentialed through the press & marketing office. https://traversecityhorseshows.com/media-credentials/
- 21. MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors, and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

Any trainer, owner, exhibitor or their agent found improperly disposing of needles or other sharp instruments will be fined \$100.

22. LIABILITY

- a) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC, Morrissey Management Group LLC, Flintfields Horse Park, LLC, Flintfields Entertainment LLC and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at all of the shows listed in this publication.
- b) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC, Morrissey Management Group LLC, Flintfields Horse Park, LLC, Flintfields Entertainment LLC and their officials and employees will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged packages received /delivered to the show grounds.
- c) "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agent or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."
- 23. PARKING PASSES: All exhibitor vehicles and trailers that enter the grounds are required to have a PARKING PASS. Passes will be provided and are FREE to participants. Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Illegally parked vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

24. MOTORIZED VEHICLES & ELECTRONICS:

Motorized Vehicles that are NOT Street Legal will be allowed on Bates Road.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others if the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

25. ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to the Travers City Horse Shows LLC and Morrissey Management Group, LLC. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment.

Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose.

At all times for horses competing on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR838 (which defines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR843 (which pertains to Poling), and GR839 (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties.

To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed:

26. POLING AND OFF-SETS: (GR843)

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at the Flintfields Horse Park grounds. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

27. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS: (GR839)

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to three lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a twenty-four hour period starting from the time of the incident.

In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's and/or Technical Delegate's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

28. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE (GR844)

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

29. Notice to All Exhibitors Regarding Helmet Rule & Ear Bud Rules

To All Riders: Please note that the Flintfield Horse Shows would like to reiterate that the mandatory helmet rule that took effect on April 1, 2012, will continue to be enforced this year at the Flintfield Horse Park. The rule has been implemented nationwide at all USEF licensed hunter/jumper competitions.

The rule requires that anyone on horseback on the property wear a helmet at all times. This consists of anyone showing, schooling, or riding horses on and off of the show grounds, including grooms. This is a facility-wide rule.

The Traverse City Horse Shows & Flintfileds Entertainment LLC will be enforcing the rule with the support of the United States Equestrian Federation. This is a zero tolerance policy and must be taken extremely serious as it is for the safety of everyone involved. Anyone on a horse without a helmet will be asked to dismount immediately.

Any insubordination will be penalized and the individuals will be fined and expelled from the property. Helmets must be worn at all times, so please plan accordingly. The Traverse City Horse Show would like to thank everyone for in advance for acting in accordance with the USEF rule GR801 which is stated.

The USEF rule GR801.2 reads:

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

USEF Rule HU157 & JP103: The use of any device with ear bud(s) while mounted is prohibited in all hunter and jumper schooling rings.
