A Butet Saddle will be awarded to the Leading Equitation Rider who accumulates the most points in competitions held in all Traverse City Horse Shows in 2025.





A full team comprises four Athletes each riding the same Horse throughout the Competition and a designated Chef D'Equipe. If a team cannot provide a team of four Athletes it may enter a team of three Athletes. All members of each team must take part in the first round, except as stated in paragraph below.

If a team, comprising four Athletes, cannot improve its placing in the first or second round after its third Athlete has completed their course, the fourth Athlete may be withdrawn.

When a team can only provide three Athletes and three Horses, the team must start their three Athletes and Horses in both rounds.

In the event of an accident or illness to an Athlete and/or Horse, between the submission of the declaration and one hour before the start of the Competition, the Athlete and/or Horse may on production of a certificate from an officially recognised medical doctor and/or with the permission of the Veterinary Commission and after approval by the Ground Jury be replaced by another Athlete and/or Horse. In the event of substitution, the starting order remains unchanged.

Elimination and retirement

Rules:

If two or more Athletes of a team, participating with four Athletes in the first or second round, are eliminated or retire, the whole team is eliminated in the respective round. If one Athlete of a team, participating with three Athletes in the first or second round, is eliminated or retires, the whole team is eliminated in the respective round.

Teams eliminated in the second round will be placed equal last in the second round and are eligible to receive prize money. Refer to JRs Art. 264.1.5 for details relating to prize money in the second round.

If a team is qualified to take part in the second round, an Athlete eliminated or retired in the first round may start in the second round. In the event that a team qualified for the second round has an Athlete who did not take part in the first round due to a fall of the Athlete and/or Horse prior to crossing the start line, the combination is not eliminated from the first round and is listed in the results as "did not start". In such a case the Athlete must be checked by the Event's medical service (or by a medical doctor if the medical service is not available), respectively the Horse must be cleared by the Veterinary Delegate before they may be permitted to start in the second round. The Ground Jury reserves the right to exclude an Athlete who has fallen from participating further in the Competition and/or the Event in accordance with Article 140.2 of the FEI General Regulations. Refer to JRs Art. 264.1.5 for details relating to prize money for teams eliminated in the second round.

In case of a fall in the practice arena, the Ground Jury will give the Athlete in question a new starting position if considered necessary.

A team, which is qualified to take part in the second round, may only withdraw from the second round with permission of the Ground Jury. In this case the team will not receive prize money and will be placed according to its Score in the first round. It will not be replaced by another team.

Placing and classification

Classification of the teams not taking part in the second round is based on the total Penalties of the three best Athletes of each team in the first round. Teams with equality of Penalties are placed according to the combined Penalties and times of their best three athletes.

Placing of teams after the second round is decided as follows: In case of equality of Penalties for the first place, there will be a jump-off in which one Athlete per team will participate. The Chef d'Equipe determines which member of their team will participate in the jump-off. Any one of the four team members, respectively three team members if applicable, may take part in the jump-off. The jump-off takes place against the clock over a minimum of six obstacles.

In case of equality of Penalties and time after the jump-off, the teams concerned will be placed equal first.

Teams with equality of total Penalties for other places after the second round are placed according to the total Penalties of their best three Athletes in both rounds and the combined times of their best three Athletes in the second round. In case of equality of total Penalties and combined times in the second round, the teams concerned will be separated by the combined times of their three best Athletes in the first round.

Starting Order: The starting order of the teams in the first round is determined by a draw in the presence of the Ground Jury and Chef D'Equipe. The draw will take place at a time fixed by management and will be announced.

All the number ones start first in succession, then all the number twos and so on. The Chefs d'Equipe of teams comprising only three Athletes may choose in which of the three positions out of four they will start their Athletes.

The starting order of the teams in the second round will be in the reverse order of the total Penalties in the first round of the best three Athletes in each team. In case of equality of Penalties the teams will start in reverse order of the combined Penalties and times of their best three Athletes in the first round.

The Athletes in each team start in the same order as in the first round.

Hunter sections may be run as back-to-back classes at management's discretion (HU125). When classes are run back-to-back, exhibitors may perform both rounds before leaving the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise indicated. Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule HU126. Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, panels. Individual hunter classes may be entered for 20% of the prize money offered in that class unless otherwise specified.

In all rated hunter sections a numerical score will be given by the judges.

In all classes over obstacles, all horses being considered for an award must jog for soundness using either Option A or Option B below. Management to decide which method of jogging will be used prior to the start of each competition week. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge's decision regarding soundness is final.

If as a result of a disobedience, a competitor displaces or knocks down any obstacle or in all cases where the nature of the obstacle is changed by a knock down, the tone is sounded and the time is stopped until the obstacle has been rebuilt. When the obstacle has been rebuilt, the tone is sounded to indicate that the course is ready and that the competitor can continue the round. The competitor is penalized for a refusal. The time is restarted at the moment when the horse leaves the ground at the obstacle where the refusal occurred. Judges are asked to walk the course when possible.

E. A minimum of three (3) riders and a maximum of twelve (12) riders (if available) will return for a flat phase. Riders to be judged on position, seat and the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Excellence and effectiveness on the flat will be rewarded. The performance begins when the class is called to order. Riders will show in both directions as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, and the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders shall be required to show at the working canter on the counter lead in each direction. Judges may require any additional tests on the flat (see EQ113). D. If as a result of a disobedience, a competitor displaces or knocks down any obstacle or in all cases where the nature of the obstacle is changed by a knock down, the tone is sounded and the time is stopped until the obstacle has been rebuilt. When the obstacle has been rebuilt, the tone is sounded to indicate that the course is ready and that the competitor can continue the round. The competitor is penalized for a refusal. The time is restarted at the moment when the horse leaves the ground at the obstacle where the refusal occurred. Judges are asked to walk the course when possible.

E. A minimum of three (3) riders and a maximum of twelve (12) riders (if available) will return for a flat phase. Riders to be judged on position, seat and the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Excellence and effectiveness on the flat will be rewarded. The performance begins when the class is called to order. Membership and Participation Requirements

- A. Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA to participate in this class. (see GR202).
- B. Horses and ponies must be registered with USHJA to participate in this class.
- C. Exception: Foreign residents and horses and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class but will not receive points unless they follow I.A. and I.B.
- D. USHJA National and Zone HOTY bonus points will only be awarded if the owner is a current Active member of USEF and USHJA and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA.
- E. Money won will only count for any USHJA National Hunter Derby standings or awards if the rider, owner and trainer are current Active members of USEF and USHJA, and the horse is registered with USHJA.
- F. Competition management is required to run the class if there are twelve (12) or more entries. They may choose to run the class with twelve (12) or less entries.
- G. The number of horses a rider can compete in a National Hunter Derby may be limited if so specified in the prize list.
- H. The prize list may specify that in order to be eligible to compete in a National Hunter Derby, a horse must compete in one (1) or two (2) classes at the same competition.
- I. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA International Hunter Derby at the same competition.
- J. Competing in the USHJA National Hunter Derby does not qualify a horse or rider for the USHJA International Hunter Derby Championship.
- K. Soundness -Horses entered in this class will NOT be required to jog for soundness. All horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the over fences phase listed below. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the authority to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the judges (GR1033.6).
- a. Traditional Format Horses must trot for soundness at the conclusion of the Classic Round. If the class is held over two days, horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of both Classic and Handy Rounds.
- b. Hunt and Go Format horses must trot for soundness at the conclusion of the Handy Round phase.
- L. In accordance with HU 174.14 the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the National Hunter Derby. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications. Due to inclement weather, competition management may excuse hunt coats or allow waterproof outerwear so long as the exhibitor's back number is worn correctly and visible.

Judging System

- A. Each class may have the option of having either one (1) or two (2) panels of judges. Each panel will consist of two (2) judges sitting together. One (1) judge on each panel must be a USEF "R" judge, the other judge on each panel may be either a USEF"R" or USEF "r" judge. Each panel will provide one (1) score for each round. See "E" for calculating the Overall Score. Management may choose to run a standard formatted Derby with fifteen (15) or fewer entries with one USEF (R) judge.
- B. No panel may award the same base score to any two (2) competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. A numerical score must be given and may be a duplicate score if it is under the cut-off.
- C. The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judge(s) base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- D. The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judge(s)' base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- E. Overall Score The final score from each round (3'0" with 3'5" options) will be added to obtain the overall total for each horse.
- F. Hunt and Go *Please note this Hunt and Go is judged differently than the International Hunter Derby Hunt and Go.

Tie Breaking Procedures

- A. No judge or panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score (before adding height bonus points) of that round.
- C. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
- D. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- E. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- F. Prior to the start of the class, if two judging panels are used, one panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the first round and another panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the second round. The tie breaking panel for the first round will also be designated as the tie breaking panel for the jump-off round.

Schooling

A. During the two rounds of the National Hunter Derby, all horses entered must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Riders must wear their horse's Derby competition number while mounted. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their Derby competition number will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited.

Order of Go

- A. The order of go must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class.
- B. In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight horses (if available) separating multiple rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second

round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off rides occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.

C. The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

Course Requirements

A. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one (1) hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round is held at another time. In that case, the course for the second round must be posted a minimum of one hour prior. Hand walking is permitted prior to the National Hunter Derby class. B. Dotted lines are prohibited in both the first and second rounds of any National Hunter Derby.

C. Jumps in ALL Rounds

1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and course must offer a variety of Classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.

- 2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are allowed.
- 3. A minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers.
- 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 18" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
- 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of 8 feet on its front face
- 6. The top element of all jumps must be in cups except for walls with movable bricks.
- 7. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
- 8. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies.
- 9. Fence height 3'0"

10. There must be four option fences set at 3'5". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting, less difficult track.

Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)

- 1. A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
- 2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs.
- 3. At least one in and out
- 4. At least one bending line
- 5. At least one line with an unrelated distance
- 6. At least one long approach

Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)

- 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.
- 2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs.
- 3. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'6" in height, halt and/or back. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
- 4. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

Competition Requirements

- A. A National Hunter Derby may be offered at USEF Licensed Channel I (Premier or National), or Channel II (Regional) rated competitions, or competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status.
- B. Competition Management will collect and remit to USHJA the \$35 per horse entrant fee at Channel I (Premier and National) rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status, and the \$25 per horse entrant fee at Channel II (Regional) competitions.
- C. Management may choose to offer a second USHJA National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs.
 - 1. Cross entry of horse between the two National Hunter Derbies is not permitted.
 - 2. The two (2) National Hunter Derbies may run concurrently or separate at the discretion of competition management.
 - 3. Prize money for each class must meet the minimum requirements outlined in Section X, as designated by the competition's rating.
 - If there are twelve (12) or less entries in either class (National Hunter Derby and National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs), the two classes must be combined. When combined, the prize money must be equal or greater than the highest amount offered to any one (1) class prior to combining
 Once the National Hunter Derby is split Junior and Amateur riders may choice to compete in the Open Section.
- D. When there are (40) or more entries, the class may be split into two (2) separate classes. If there are fifty (50) or more entries, the class must be split into two (2) or three (3) separate classes. Management may determine a cutoff time for entering before splitting the National Hunter Derby. The cutoff time will be no earlier than 24 hours prior to the proposed start time of the National Hunter Derby. When the class is split, the original advertised prize money offered must be doubled, or tripled, and split in accordance to how many sections are offered.
 - 1. A two-way split will be offered as one Open section and one Restricted section for Juniors and Amateurs.

a. If there are fewer than twelve (12) entries in either the Open or Restricted section, then the original entry list will be split by a random draw into two equal sections.

- b. Prize Money for a two-way split will be divided equally at 50% to each section.
- 2. A three-way split will be offered as one Open section, one Junior section, and one Amateur section.
- a. If there are fewer than twelve in any section, then a two-way split must be utilized.

b. Prize Money for a three-way split will be divided to each section as follows: 33% to the Open section, 33.5% to the Junior section, and 33.5% to the Amateur section.

3. If there are fifty (50) or more entries in any section after the original split, then the section will be divided in half by a random draw and placed separately. Prize money must be divided equally at 50% to each new section. Management must adjust the entry fee according to the reduced prize money offered if the sections are split. If the sections are split but the entry fee is not reduced, then prize money must be doubled.

4. Cross-entry of horses between the two (2) or three (3) National Hunter Derbies is not permitted.

Awards: Trophy to first, one set of Ribbons thru 12th place; prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%.

Course Requirements

A. Jumps in ALL Rounds

- 1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
- Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are not allowed.
- 3. A minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers.
- 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 16" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no groundline is necessary.
- 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of eight feet on its front face.
- 6. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
- 7. Fence heights: 2'6"
- B. Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)
 - 1. A minimum of nine obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
 - 2. At least one bending line.
 - 3. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
 - 4. At least one long approach.
- C. Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)
 - 1. A minimum of seven obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.

2. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'0" in height, halt and/or back. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.

3. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 from the first round are eligible to return for the second round. Tie Breaking Procedures

A. No panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.

B. Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score of that round.

C. Twelve (12) entries are to return for the second round, only the top twelve (12) horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

D. In the event of a ties for the overall standings, the tie will be broken using the second round base score.

Membership & Eligibility

A. Riders, owners, and trainers mus the current Active members of the Federation and USHJA to participate in this class.

B. Ponies must be registered with USHJA to participate in this class.

- C. Ponies must have a valid measurement card or form issued by the Federation.
- D. Riders must be a junior to be eligible to compete in the USHJA Pony Hunter Derby.
- E.Exception: Foreign residents and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class.

F. Points earned will only count for any USHJA Pony Hunter Derby standings or awards if the rider, owner and trainer are current Active members of the Federation and USHJA, and the pony is registered with USHJA.

G. Riders may compete on a total of four ponies but no more than two of any one size.

H. Rider age and pony size: See HU141 for current Federation policy. Any rider under the age of18 years may compete on any pony that is eligible for the Green Pony Hunter section.

I. In order to be eligible to compete in a Pony Hunter Derby, a pony must compete in one or two classes at the same competition.

J. In accordance with HU170.14 the same pony-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the Pony Hunter Derby.

K. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the Federation Rule Book for current specifications.

Judging System

A. The judging panel will provide one score and the scores from each round will be added together to obtain the overall total for each pony. This overall total score will determine the final overall standings for the class.

B. The Classic Hunter Style Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. C. The Handy Hunter Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible.

D. The Jump-Off Round, if required, shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible.

E. Soundness will be judged on the closing circle at the end of the Classic round. No jog is required at the conclusion of the Handy round.

Tie Breaking Procedures

- A. The judging panel may not award the same base score to any two competitors in anyone round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. Only the top 12 ponies from the first round are eligible to return for the second round.

C. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second-round score.

D. Ties for other than first place in the over all standings will be broken using the second-round score.

Awards: Trophy to first, one set of Ribbons thru 12th place, prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%. All riders in the top12 overall (or their designated representative if not available) must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.

Membership and Participation Requirements

A. Open to horses of any age that are eligible to compete as a Green 3'0", 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" Hunter under Federation rules. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify the USEF Green eligibility of the horse before competing.

B. Horses must be enrolled in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Program and pay the annual enrollment fee prior to competing in the Regional Championship. Additionally, horses must be registered with USHJA and recorded with USEF to participate. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enroll their horse in a timely manner in order to be eligible to participate.

C. Horses may only be enrolled online. If a horse is enrolled during a competition, the horse's enrollment date will be considered the first day of the competition at which it was enrolled.

D. Enrolled horses are not required to have competed in a Green Hunter section at any USEF Licensed Competition to compete in a Regional Championship. However, competing in a Regional Championship will affect their Green status.

E. Soundness – horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the over fences performance. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the authority to disqualify a horse due to unsoundness at any time during the over fences performance.

F. Horses may be ridden by a Professional, Junior or Amateur.

G. Horses may compete in multiple Regional Championships per year.

Judging Format

A. The Green Hunter Regional Championship shall be judged on quality, and way of going, using the open numerical scoring system.

B. A score will be announced after each round.

C. The class will be judged by a minimum of two Registered (LargeR) USEF Hunter Licensed judges.

D. Rounds one and two will each account for 50% of the total score. Awards will be distributed based on the cumulative total of both rounds.

Course Requirements

A. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the class.

B. Fences must be set at 3'0", 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" in height in accordance with how management chooses to offer and conduct the class and courses must be suitable for Green Hunters.

Competition Requirements

A. One regional championship per region will be established per competition year.

B. Competition management will collect and remit to USHJA a fee of \$20 per entry at Channel I rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status.

C. Competition management must check at www.ushja.org to verify that all entries in the USHJA Green Hunter Regional Championship have been officially enrolled in the Green Hunter Incentive Program.

D. Competitions must offer each height section (3', 3'3", 3'6", 3'9"). Competitions may combine height sections.

E. The two round USHJA Green Hunter Regional Championship must be held in a featured location. It is to be promoted and conducted by management as one of the featured classes of the competition.

F. The first round of the USHJA Green Hunter Regional Championship may be run concurrently with another Green Hunter Stake class or championship. The second round must be held separately.

G. A USHJA Green Hunter Regional Championship must run if there are a minimum of six (6) entries.

H. The second round must be run with 12 qualified entries. Exception: if championship entries are fewer than 12, all entries who were not eliminated in the first round must be allowed to enter the second round.

I. Competition management must report the results of this class separately from the results of the Green Hunter height section classes and send a copy of these results to both the USEF and USHJA within 10 days of the conclusion of the competition.

J. USHJA will supply a limited amount of ribbons and coolers. Competitions may offer additional awards at their own expense. The USHJA reserves the right to supplement awards.

Membership and Participation Requirements

A. Riders, Owners, and Trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA before the start of the championship.

B. Horses must be recorded with the Federation and registered with USHJA and enrolled in the USHJA International Hunter Derby Program.

C.Horses must be enrolled in the USHJA International Hunter Derby Program.

D. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA International Hunter Derby Regional Championship and the National Hunter Derby at the same competition.

E. Horses entered in this class are not required to show in any other hunter or jumper classes at the horse show.

F. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.

G. Rider Change Policy - in an extenuating circumstance that a rider is unable to continue to

compete in the Handy Round of the Derby, the rider and/or trainer must request permission from competition management to change riders. Rider substitutions must be made with riders in the same Tier eligibility.

H. Horses may compete in multiple Regional Championships per year.

Stabling/Schooling

A. All horses competing in the Derby Regional Championship must be on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the first round.

B. All horses will be monitored and must remain on the competition grounds until the horse is finished competing in the Derby Regional Championship. Any horse that leaves the premises prior to completing its participation in theDerby Regional Championship is disqualified.

Soundness

A. Horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the Classic Round. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the authority to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound.

Judging Requirements

A. There will be a total of four judges for this class. Judges will be seated separately in two panels consisting of two judges per panel. The location of each panel should provide two distinct lines- of-sight when possible.

B. Each judging panel may consist of either two R-licensed hunter judges or one R-licensed hunter judge and one r-licensed hunter judge.

C. All judges must be Federation licensed and in good standing with the Federation and USHJA.

D. No guest cards will be granted for this competition.

E. A judging assistant must be present during all phases of the competition. The duties of the judging assistant include notifying the Judges if a rail comes down and when a horse jumps the higher height option fences. The judging assistant is not required to be a licensed official and is not responsible for the scoring of the judging panels. A competition staff member may fill this role.

Judging Format

A. The Classic Hunter Style Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style,manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. These two scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.

B. The Handy Hunter Round shall be judged on jumping style and efficiency while maintaining style and form, way of going, and overall flow. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and a Handy Bonus Score on a scale of 0- 5 to award handiness in the round. These three scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse- and-rider combination for this round.

C. The Jump-Off Round, if required, shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. These scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse- and-rider combination for this round.

D. The total scores of each horse-and-rider combination from each round will be added together to determine their final overall Hunter Derby score. This score will determine the final overall standings for the class.

E. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awardedeven if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. Competition Requirements

A. One regional championship per region will be established per competition year at USEF licensed Channel I rated competitions and competitions approved for a standalone status.

B. Competition management will collect and remit to USHJA a fee of \$50 per horse.

C. Competition management must check at www.ushja.org to verify that all entries in the

USHJA International Hunter Derby Regional Championship have been officially enrolled

in the International Hunter Derby Program.

D. The two-round USHJA International Hunter Derby Regional Championship must be

held in a featured location. It is to be promoted and conducted by management as one of the featured classes of the competition.

E. The Regional Championship must be run if there are 3 entries. If there are 5 or less entries, then prize money may be reduced to \$5,000. With 6 or more entries, prize money must be distributed as offered.

F. Competition management must send a copy of the results to both the USEF and USHJA within 10 days of the conclusion of the competition.

G. USHJA will supply ribbons and coolers. Competitions are responsible for all other awards. However, the USHJA reserves the right to supplement awards.

The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round and/or jump-off are scheduled at least two hours after the Classic Round. In that case, the course for the second and/or jump-off rounds must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the second round. Copies of the course(s) must also be available for distribution at the Riders Meeting. B. Jumps in all Rounds.

1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of Derby jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.

2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are allowed.

- 3. A minimum 2" difference is required for the back element of an obstacle.
- 4. The jumpable portion of any obstacle must be a minimum of eight feet on its front face.
- 5. Flat cups may only be used for obstacles involving logs and/or in accordance with Federation rules.
- 6. The top rail of all obstacles must rest in a cup, except where walls with movable bricks are used.
- C. Classic Hunter Style Round (First Round)
- 1. A minimum of 10 obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Style Round.
- 2. Fences must be set at 3'6 to 4'0" in height, exception option fences.

3. The course must include higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'0" in height (See Star System for further details). The number of higher height option fences cannot exceed four and the jumpcups on those fences must be normal deep cups of 25-30 mm. If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting obstacles and be on the less difficult track.

- 4. At least one in and out.
- 5. At least one bending line.

6. At least one line with an unrelated distance. 7. At least one fence with a long approach.

D. Handy Hunter Round (Second Round)

1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.

2. Fences must be set at 3'6" to 4'0" in height, exception option fences.

3. The course must include higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'0" in height (See Star System for further details). The number of higher height option fences cannot exceed four and the jump cups on those fences must be normal deep cups of 25-30 mm. If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting obstacles and be on theless difficult track.

4. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of three of the followinghandy options: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 3'0" in height. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.

5. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

E. Jump-Off Round

1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the jump-off round.

2. Fences must be set at 3'6' to 4'0" in height, exception option fences.

3. There will be no high options for the Jump Off Round.

F. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two of the following handy options: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 3'0" in height, halt and/or back. Leading over anobstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted are not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.

Tie Breaking Procedures

A. Unless the prize list states that more than twelve (12) entries are to return for the second round, only the top twelve (12) horses from the first round are eligible to return for the second round.

B. All ties for overall first place in the class may compete in a jump-off round. If both exhibitors agree NOT to jump off, the exhibitors will be named cowinners. Prize money will be split evenly, and ties entrants must determine the distribution of awards amongst themselves. If one of the tied exhibitors declines to jump off, that exhibitor must sign a forfeiture agreement which will be provided at the time of the jump off.

C. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will remain tied. Prize money will be split evenly and tied entrants must determine the distribution of awards amongst themselves

a. Number to hold separate sections: Performance: four (4) and High Perform-ance three (3). If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113. b. Combining

1. At all licensed competitions, if there are fewer than four entries in either the Performance Hunter 3'3" or Performance Hunter 3'6" they must be combined. but they cannot be combined with any other Hunter sections, except High Performance Hunter. If there are four or more entries in each Performance Hunter section, they must be held separately. If the Performance Hunter 3' 6" and the Performance Hunter 3'3" sections have fewer than three entries after they have been combined they may be further combined with the High Performance Hunter section.

2. If there are fewer than three entries in the High Performance Hunter section it must first be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section or the Green Hunter 3'9" section (or with Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" if offered combined). If the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section it may then further be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'3" section, but may not be combined with the Green Hunter section(s).

3. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter section the following applies: a. When combining High Performance Hunter with Performance Hunters, the

combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Performance Hunter section(s) with which it is combined.

b. When combining High Performance Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry

4. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:

a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section

b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must be combined with High Performance Working Hunter.

c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section.

d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6". Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section

The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections.

c. Dividing:

1. In Performance Hunter, High Performance Hunter and any other sections where individual classes may be entered, the sections may only be divided after thirty (30) horses have competed in the first over fences class. Subsequent classes may be divided once twelve (12) horses have competed in each class. For Championships, see HU154,

Green Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3).

b. Combining:

1. Green Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other hunter section(s) (Exception; The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" and 3'9" sections, see HU164.1)

2. Regardless of competition rating, each Green Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries. 3. If there are fewer than three entries in a Green Hunter section, that section

must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter. 4 If after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter

5. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two noncontiguous fence height sections may be combined.

6. If Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'0" and/or 3'3" sections are combined with Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and/or Green Hunter 3'9" sec-tions a Handy Hunter class is not required. The combined sections must meet class number requirements for Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and Green Hunter 3'9" and use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees. 7. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:

a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section.

b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must be combined with High Performance Working Hunter. c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete

in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section

d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section.

f. The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections

c. Dividina:

1. Regardless of competition rating, any Green Hunter section that is offered combined must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or as one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections

Young Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3). b. Combining: 1. Young Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other Hunter section.

2. At Competition Management's discretion, and with at least three (3) Young Hunters entered in any section, the Young Hunter Section(s) may run concurrently with the corresponding Green Hunter height section or Combined Green Hunter Section. Horses that are entered in both the Young Hunter and Green Hunter section(s) will be eligible for awards in both sections. Horses that are not entered in both sections will only be eligible for awards in the section in which they are entered. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in any of the Young Hunter section(s) they must be combined for awards per HU166.3. A separate entry fee for the Young Hunter Section will apply. The Green Hunter section requirements by rating listed in HU166.2 will still apply.

 Regardless of competition rating, each Young Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in a Young Hunter section that section must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non- contiguous fence height sections those two non-contiguous fence height sections may be combined.

c. Dividing: 1. Regardless of competition rating, any Young Hunter section that is offered as a combined section must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections.

Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" and High Performance Conformation Hunter a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3). b. Combining:

1. The Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" may only be combined with the High Performance Conformation Hunter. The High Performance Conformation Hunter may only be combined with the Green Conformation Hunter 3'6".

2. When offered as two sections, if there are fewer than three (3) horses in either the Green Conformation 3'6" or the High Performance Conformation section they must be combined.

3. When combining Green Conformation Hunter with High Performance Conformation Hunter, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined section will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

c. Dividing: If there are three (3) or more horses in each Conformation section they must be held separately.

Junior Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: four (4) in each section. If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.

b. Combining:

1. The Junior Hunter 3'6". Junior Hunter 3'3". Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6". and Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3" sections may only be combined with other Junior Hunter or Amateur Owner Hunter sections.

See below for conditions.

2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, Competition Management may choose to combine the sections. The Competition Management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ122). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count. 3. It is recommended that when competitions anticipate 50 horses or more this section be divided by age of rider or height of horse when prize list is prepared. c. Dividing:

1. When divided, sections must be split using one of the methods from HU161 Methods of Dividing.

2. If there are 50 or more entries in the section at the beginning of the first class it must be divided and the prize money must be doubled

3. If there are 50 or more entries remaining in a section after it has been divided, the section must be redivided and the prize money must be doubled. Once a section has been redivided it may be divided further if management so desires. 4. If the Junior Hunter sections are divided by height of animal, they must be divided into Large and Small. Premier rated Junior Hunter 3'6" sections at Premier rated competitions must be offered as four sections (large/vounger, large/older, small/ younger, small/older).

5. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in any sections divided by age and/or height of animal, those sections must be combined with other sections. If there is a minimum of twelve (12) entries once any sections have been combined, the newly combined section must be redivided.

Amateur Owner Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: four (4) in each section. If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113. b. Combining:

1. The Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6", Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3", Junior Hunter 3'6", and Junior Hunter

3'3" sections may only be combined with other Amateur Owner Hunter or Junior Hunter sections See below for conditions.

2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3" the Amateur Owner 3'6" the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, competition management may choose to combine the sections. The competition management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ121). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count. 3. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, these sections may be combined The competition management may choose to combine the classes as necessary. based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered c. Dividing:

1. Amateur Owner 3'6" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either divided section. they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be redivided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU162 & HU160 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on the entry blank.

When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number. 2. Amateur Owner 3'3" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either divided section, they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be re-divided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU164 & HU162 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on entry blank. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

Pony Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3). b. Combinina:

1. The Regular Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections. 2. Height sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) in any height section. Combined

height sections should be either small/medium or medium/large but if possible not small/large. c. Dividing:

Classes for Pony Hunters may be divided by height of pony as outlined in HU141

2. If there are 50 or more entries in the division at the beginning of the first class, it must be divided by height of pony and prize money must be doubled. 3. If there are 50 entries remaining in a section after the section has been divided

by height of pony, the section must be re-divided by every other number and the prize money must be doubled.

Once a section has been re-divided it may not be divided further

5. If a pony under saddle class has over 30 entries, the class must be split and held in at least two sections with one set of awards.

6. If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height Section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); If there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled.

Green Pony Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3) per section. b. Combining:

1. The Green Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections. 2. Green Pony Hunter Sections at National and Premier rated competitions may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in any height section. c. Dividing: 1. National and Premier rated competitions must split (small, medium and large) if there are four (4) or more entries in any height section.

If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); prize money need not be doubled. If there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled

Adult Amateur Hunter

Adult Amateur Hunter a. Competitions must offer Adult Amateur Hunter sections in accordance with the specifications of each USHJA Zone. b. Notice of the use of a floating split and the age groups must be posted at the competition office. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. Age must be given on entry blank. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

Children's Hunter a. Children's Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications

Low Adult Hunter

Low Adult Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications.

Low Children's Hunter a. Low Children's Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications

Championship Schedule for all height sections

- 1. 1.10-1.15m Junior and Amateur Championship; spreads up to 1.25m
- 2. 1.20-1.25m Junior and Amateur Championship; spreads up to 1.40m
- 3. The speed for both height sections is 350m/m.

A. Day One (First Round of the Team ZJTC and First Individual Qualifying Class)

- The class will be conducted under a Table II, Section 1. Faults and Time. (JP 146.2) The results of this class will be decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course. Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course, shall receive 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round who completed the course and received a score.
- 2. Individual Classification: Faults and time from Day One will be carried forward to the Individual Standings.
- 3. The order of the individuals on a team will be determined by the Chefs and given to the USHJA representative at the Riders' Meeting. Teams of three will start with their first rider in the second rotation. Athletes competing as individuals will start before the teams. The order for the individuals in the first round will be drawn at the Riders' Meeting.
- 4. The top three team member scores from this round serves as the first-round team score. This cumulative score will be added to the round two team cumulative score the next day to determine the final team standings.
- Class Awards: Ribbons will be awarded through 8th place. Prize money: 10% of the section's overall prize money will be paid through 8th as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%, 5%.

B. Day Two (Second Individual Qualifying Class and Second Round of Team Competition)

1. Specifications:

This class will be conducted under a modified Table II. The results of this class will be decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course shall receive 20 faults more than the highest penalized competitor in that round who completed the course and received a score.

- 2. Scoring
 - a. Day Two is open only to athlete/horse combinations that have started (whether eliminated or not) on Day One.
 - b. Athletes eliminated or retiring from the course shall receive a score equal to 20 faults more than that received by the highest penalized competitor in that round.
 - c. A team's top three scores from Day Two serves as the second-round team score.
 - d. The winning team will have the lowest combined score from Day One and Day Two.
 - e. Any team tied for a medal shall jump off. Each team's Chef d'Equipe will select one athlete to represent the team in the jump-off.
 - f. If jump-offs for multiple medals are required, the jump-off for the bronze medal will occur first.
 - g. The placing of teams tied below medal positions will be decided by the combined times from the three highest placed riders on a team from Day One.
- 3. Start Order: The starting order of teams will be the reverse order of team scores from (Day One). Any teams tied will go in the order of their first-round drawn order.
- 4. In the second round (Day Two) Individual Athletes will start before the teams. The order of go will be according to reverse order of total penalties from Day One. In case of individuals with equal penalties, the athletes will go in the order of their first-round drawn order.

5. Class Awards:

Medals will be awarded to the gold, silver, and bronze teams, ribbons will be awarded through 3rdplace, along with any trophy or other prizes that management chooses to award. The gold team must ride for ribbons, silver and bronze teams will enter the ring on foot for a podium presentation. Prize money: 30% of the section's overall prize money will be paid to the Gold, Silver, and Bronze winning teams. Prize money will be paid through 3rd as follows: 50%, 30%, 20% and divided equally among the team's members.

C. Day Three (Individual Final)

- 1. This Class will be scored under Table II, Section 2.
- 2. The top 15 athlete/horse combinations based on the cumulative scores from Day One and Day Two, including ties for 15th place, are eligible to compete. Athletes must not have been eliminated in either of the two rounds of the competition. The list of the top 15 will be posted and distributed as soon as feasible after Day Two concludes and medals are awarded. Following this posting, if one or more of the qualified athlete/horse combinations is unable to start in the Individual Final, the combination will not be replaced by a lower ranked athlete. Faults will carry over from the previous rounds and be added to any faults from the final round to determine the placings. Ties below overall third (bronze), will be determined by the time on Day One.
- 3. Start Order: The start order will be the reverse order of riders' total scores From Day One and Day Two. In the event of an equality of scores, the result from Day One will decide, with a lower placing athlete/horse combination going before a higher placing competitor.
- 4. Jump-Off: There will be a jump-off in the case of a tie for an individual medal. Competitors will jump off in the same start order of the Individual Final. If jump-offs for multiple medals are required, the jump-off for the lowest medal will occur first.

5. Class Awards:

Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals provided by the USHJA will be awarded to the top three individuals, along with ribbons to 8th and other specified prizes or prize money as may be specified by the organizers and the USHJA. Top 3 overall must ride for ribbons. Gold, silver, and bronze medal individuals must remain in the arena for a podium presentation. Prize money: 60% of the section's overall prize money will be paid through 8th as follows: 30%, 22%, 15%, 10%, 7%, 6%, 5%.

6. The Individual Medalists are invited to participate in one of the USHJA Gold Star clinics.

Qualifying List

- 1. Each section will accept a total of 32 athlete/horse combinations. Each zone is guaranteed to accept two full teams. After all zone teams are fielded, additional riders will be accepted from the qualifying list to fill any remaining spots and formulate a combined zone team.
- Should the maximum number of 32 athlete/horse combinations not be met in any section, an athlete may ask to be included in the ZJTC at the site. The athlete/horse combination must meet eligibility requirements and apply to the USHJA representative at the ZJTC competition 24 hours before the horse inspection. If a team spot is unavailable, the additional athlete/horse combination will compete as an individual.

Horse Rules and Regulations

Horse Inspection and jog for soundness: this involves a formal inspection of the horse using an official identification document and includes jog for soundness.

1. ZJTC horses must be stabled on the show grounds, in official horse show stabling beginning no later than one hour prior to the horse inspection and remaining on the grounds until the completion of the ZJTC.

2. Horses competing in the ZJTC may not compete in any other class at the same horse show after the official horse inspection has taken place. Exception: ZJTC Training class, if offered.

3. All ZJTC horses must be presented at the mandatory horse inspection by the athlete or designated representative. The horse inspection will be held no more than 24 hours prior to the start of the First Individual Qualifying Class. The exact time and location will be included in the prize list and schedule for each ZJTC.

4. A designated representative other than the rider, who must be at least 18 years of age, may present the horse at the horse inspection.

5. Each horse must be presented with its entry number and current Coggins and or passport (USEF proof of horse registration). Following the horse inspection, the assigned back number must always accompany the horse when it is out of its stall and must be visible on the stall door when in the stall.

6. Horses not accepted at the horse inspection will have the opportunity to be re-presented once, prior to the First Individual Qualifying Class.

7. If a horse is not accepted at the initial horse inspection the horse may not participate in the ZJTC Training Session if it is held prior to the re-inspection. Horses not accepted at the re-inspection will not compete in the ZJTC. Horses may not participate in any concurrently held competition during which the ZJTC is held 48 hours following the horse inspection. (GR914.3)

Tack/ Equipment

USEF Rules: USEF rules will govern these ZJTC (JP 111). Additionally, please pay particular attention to the specifics listed below:

1. Martingales

- a. Standing martingales, Running Martingales and Irish martingales are permitted in the 1.10/1.15m ZJTC and the 1.20/1.25m ZJTC.
- b. The use of any other type of martingale will be cause for elimination from that ZJTC championship day. (See also VIII.C.2)
- c. The use of draw reins, German martingales, chambons, or any other unconventional equipment is not allowed at any time during the ZJTCs, including schooling. Exception: The use of draw reins is permissible during awards presentations and victory gallops.

2. Equipment

a. Boot regulations- Refer to rule JP111.5.

Athlete Rules and Regulations

Qualifying List

- 1. Each section will accept a total of 32 athlete/horse combinations. Each zone is guaranteed to accept two full teams. After all zone teams are fielded, additional riders will be accepted from the qualifying list to fill any remaining spots and create a combined zone team.
- 2. Should the maximum number of 32 athlete/horse combinations not be met in any section, an athlete may ask to be included in the PJC at the PJC site. The athlete/horse combination must meet eligibility requirements and apply to the USHJA representative at the PJC competition 24 hours before the horse inspection. Horse Rules and Regulations

Horse Inspection and jog for soundness

Following the horse inspection, the assigned back number must always accompany the horse when it is out of its stall and must be visible on the stall door when in the stall.

b. Horses not accepted at the horse inspection will have the opportunity to be re-presented once, prior to the First Individual Qualifying Class.

c. If a horse is not accepted at the initial horse inspection, the horse may not participate in the PJC Training Session, if the Training Session is held prior to the re-inspection. Horses not accepted at the re-inspection will not compete in the PJC. Horses may not participate in any concurrently held competition during which the PJC for 48 hours following the horse inspection. (GR914.3)

Tack/ Equipment



General Rules & Regulations

 Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book and FEI Rules, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE, COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRES-SAGE COMPETITIONS, ENDURANCE RIDES AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS: (SEE GR828.4 OF THE FEDERATION RULES). LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETI-TIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, OR AGENT, AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETI-TIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF IN-TRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS, 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HAN-DLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES

Federation Entry Agreement - By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right to publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchip HU104: As of December 1, 2017, all horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered.

A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in thenuchal ligament of the animal.

This rule will have a transition period from December 1, 2017 to November 30, 2018. During this period, animals that are not in compliance with this rule will not receive points or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards. After this period, all horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions. Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

2. ENTRIES:

- a) Entries open immediately upon publication of this prize list.
- b) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC requires that nomination fees, hunter, equitation fees, stabling fee, and USEF Drug & Admin fee or FEI Drug and Admin fee, EMT/HEART Ambulance Fee \$30, Nightwatch fee \$20 per horse per show & a non refundable Office Processing Fee \$90 accompany each entry blank.

Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to the **Traverse City Horse Shows, LLC** in United States funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed.

3. ENTRIES & NOMINATIONS

a) Entries after the closing date May 14 will be accepted with a late fee of \$100 per horse.

Entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion. A post entry late charge of \$40 per class or \$80 per hunter section will apply after the closing date of entries.

- b) Nominations for all noted non FEI Jumper Sections \$250. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$40 unless otherwise stated.
- c) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (see Rule No. 15) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 pm the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes.
- d) Late or improper Grand Prix/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 \$35,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 will be assessed without exception. In the event of acceptance of a later declaration where Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- e) Horses competing in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- f) NIGHT WATCH: All horses occupying a stall, whether showing or not, are required to pay a one time per show NightWatch fee of \$20 per show. This service is NOT OPTIONAL. Horses will be checked 6 times each night beginning at 7pm on Monday through 6am the following Monday. Please provide emergency contact name and cell phone or hotel room and phone number at your stalls.
- g) Each entry form must give the owner, rider, trainer, and horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider and trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers.
- h) USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$8 Drug & Medication, \$15 USEF) (FEI horses \$33 fee) and a \$10 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their USEF/ USHJA membership card to the Competition Secretary. Failure to present a USEF card will result in having to pay non-member fees. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card ust be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced. .
- i) USEF Eligibility/ USHJA Show Pass Fees:

USEF Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.

Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.

To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.

The eligibility requirement for foreign participants went into effect on September 1, 2023, and under this requirement, foreign participants are no longer permitted to participate in USEF national competitions by merely demonstrating good standing with their own National Federation. A few important notes on this:

- Foreign Participants will now be required to join USEF as Competing Members.
- Those individuals 18 years of age and older must take SafeSport Training to be eligible to participate in USEF national competitions.
- For those participating in FEI events only, this requirement does not apply.
- This requirement has been in effect since September 1, 2023, for all foreign competitors except Equestrian Canada competitors.
 - The online Show Pass form will be available on the USEF website and can be accessed at the following URL: https://www.usef.org/show-pass The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.

USHJA Show Pass fee for non members of the USHJA \$30 per competition.

- j) USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix are subject to USEF International High Performance fee. A \$35 per horse fee will be accessed for each horse on a per class basis.
- k) The responsible party as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- I) If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions; management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on USEF National Horse of The Year points earned from December 1, 2023 to November 30, 2024. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries.
- M A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.
- n) Non competing horses will be charged a fee of \$150 per week.
- All horses are required to wear a back number when leaving the stables and on the competition grounds.

4. SCRATCHES:

a) Horses entered in hunter sections, classes or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$125 per jumper or \$100 per hunter. The Office Processing Fee is non refundable.

Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary prior to the start of the class or classes being scratched. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition.

- b) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- c) \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the competition, an Official Veterinarian's Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any class at the competition, no refund of the nominating fee will be given.
- 5. HUNTER SCORING: The open numerical hunter scoring system will be used at the discretion of Management.
- 6. COURTESY CIRCLE: Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes in accordance with USEF rules.
- HORS CONCOURS: No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concurs' during the competition.
- COMPETITION RING ACCESS: Flatting will be allowed in all rings except the Grand Prix ring up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the first class. Weather permitting. Unless otherwise noted.
- 9. NUMBERS: Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.
- 10. ATTIRE:
 - a) Appropriate dress is required in all classes.
 - b) Formal attire: JUMPERS: Scarlet, dark blue, dark green or black coat; white shirt with white tie, white choker or white stock; white, fawn, or canary breeches, protective headgear See GR 801, black or brown boots. No exceptions.
 - c) Formal attire: HUNTERS: Riders are required to wear scarlet dark coats; white shirts with white stock; white, buff or canary breeches and hunting cap, derby, hunting silk hat, or protective headgear. See GR 801, HU128 and EQ105.182
 - Jumper riders may wear breeches and solid colored polo shirts unless otherwise noted.

 ALL exhibitors must wear properly fitted protective headgear with a chin strap that passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards while riding on the competition grounds. (USEF GR 801.2)

11. AWARD CEREMONIES:

Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Team competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present will result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class.

12. ORDERS OF GO: Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU 159. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that the necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over three minutes due to conflicts.

13. STABLING:

- Traverse City Horse Shows LLC have the right to permit horses to come and go at will. We have elected to do so within certain guidelines upholding our no poling policy.
- b) Weekly Stalls 10'x10',will be temporary housed under canvas and stall doors will be provided at a fee of \$395 per stall tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries. Stall mats included.

Permanent National Weekly Stalls (Limited Availability) 10x12 housed under hard cover with doors and mats provided, will be provided at a fee of \$500 per stall tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries.

FEI stalls 10'x12', - extra tack stalls will be provided at a fee of \$500 per stall tax included for each FEI competition. Stalls must be reserved by the closing date of entries. Stall mats included.

A charge of \$25 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date of entries. Layover stabling \$45/day.

- c) No trailering in or working off trailers will be allowed.
- d) Grounds Fee: \$50 will be assessed to horses who are hacking onto the grounds for any reason. Back numbers must be obtained from the show office and worn at all times.
- e) Initial bedding will not be provided.
- f) Unless special arrangements are made with management, stalls must be vacated no later than 8:00am the day following the conclusion of each competition.
- g) STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES
- Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done to their stalls, intentionally or not, and will be charged accordingly.
- i) Stable flooring is a limestone base.
- j) Horses are not allowed to share a stall during the competition week. Show accounts may only have a whole stall applied. No splits for the week.
- 14. COURSES: In all jumper classes, courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, rails, planks, water, liverpool, ditch, wall and panels. In all hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as; brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank and panels.
- 15. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS: Competition days Open one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 4:00 pm whichever is later. Non-Competition Day hours will be from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm.
- 16. ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT: All accounts must be settled in full no later than 4:00 pm on the last day of each scheduled competition. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the grounds, a release must be obtained from the Competition Secretary. If you are providing barn splits to the office please note there can be no sharing of a stall on accounts for the week. The office is unable to split stalls into fractions.

17. PRIZE MONEY:

- a) All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form in order to receive prize money. Prize money will be credited to entry show account. IRS 1099 Miscellaneous Income Forms will be issued to the payee as listed on the entry form.
- b) Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.
- c) Prize Money will be credited to the horse account and any remaining credit balance will be mailed within 30 days of completion of show.
- 18. FEED & BEDDING: Provided by the 'Official Feed Store' of the Traverse City Horse Shows & Flintfileds Entertainment LLC. In order to assure exhibitors of an adequate supply of feed based on fair market prices, no other feed vendor other than the Official Feed Store will be permitted on the grounds without the express permission of the Management. email: feed.glef@gmail.com
- 19. DOGS: All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the show

grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.

- 20. OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHERS: Photographers must be credentialed through the press & marketing office. https://traversecityhorseshows.com/media-credentials/
- 21. MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors, and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

Any trainer, owner, exhibitor or their agent found improperly disposing of needles or other sharp instruments will be fined \$100.

22. LIABILITY

- a) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC, Morrissey Management Group LLC, Flintfields Horse Park, LLC, Flintfields Entertainment LLC and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at all of the shows listed in this publication.
- b) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC, Morrissey Management Group LLC, Flintfields Horse Park, LLC, Flintfields Entertainment LLC and their officials and employees will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged packages received /delivered to the show grounds.
- c) "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agent or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."
- 23. PARKING PASSES: All exhibitor vehicles and trailers that enter the grounds are required to have a PARKING PASS. Passes will be provided and are FREE to participants. Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Illegally parked vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

24. MOTORIZED VEHICLES & ELECTRONICS:

Motorized Vehicles that are NOT Street Legal will be allowed on Bates Road.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

25. ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to the Travers City Horse Shows LLC and Morrissey Management Group, LLC. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose.

At all times for horses competing on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR838 (which defines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR843 (which pertains to Poling), and GR839 (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties.

To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed:

26. POLING AND OFF-SETS: (GR843)

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at the Flintfields Horse Park grounds. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

27. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS: (GR839)

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to three lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a twenty-four hour period starting from the time of the incident.

In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's and/or Technical Delegate's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

28. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE (GR844)

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

29. SAFESPORT TRAINING - Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Notice to All Exhibitors Regarding Helmet Rule & Ear Bud Rules

To All Riders: Please note that the Flintfield Horse Shows would like to reiterate that the mandatory helmet rule that took effect on April 1, 2012, will continue to be enforced this year at the Flintfield Horse Park. The rule has been implemented nationwide at all USEF licensed hunter/jumper competitions.

The rule requires that anyone on horseback on the property wear a helmet at all times. This consists of anyone showing, schooling, or riding horses on and off of the show grounds, including grooms. This is a facility-wide rule.

The Traverse City Horse Shows & Flintfileds Entertainment LLC will be enforcing the rule with the support of the United States Equestrian Federation. This is a zero tolerance policy and must be taken extremely serious as it is for the safety of everyone involved. Anyone on a horse without a helmet will be asked to dismount immediately.

Any insubordination will be penalized and the individuals will be fined and expelled from the property. Helmets must be worn at all times, so please plan accordingly. The Traverse City Horse Show would like to thank everyone for in advance for acting in accordance with the USEF rule GR801 which is stated.

The USEF rule GR801.2 reads:

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

USEF Rule HU157 & JP103: The use of any device with ear bud(s) while mounted is prohibited in all hunter and jumper schooling rings.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

• Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

• Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)

• Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)

- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
