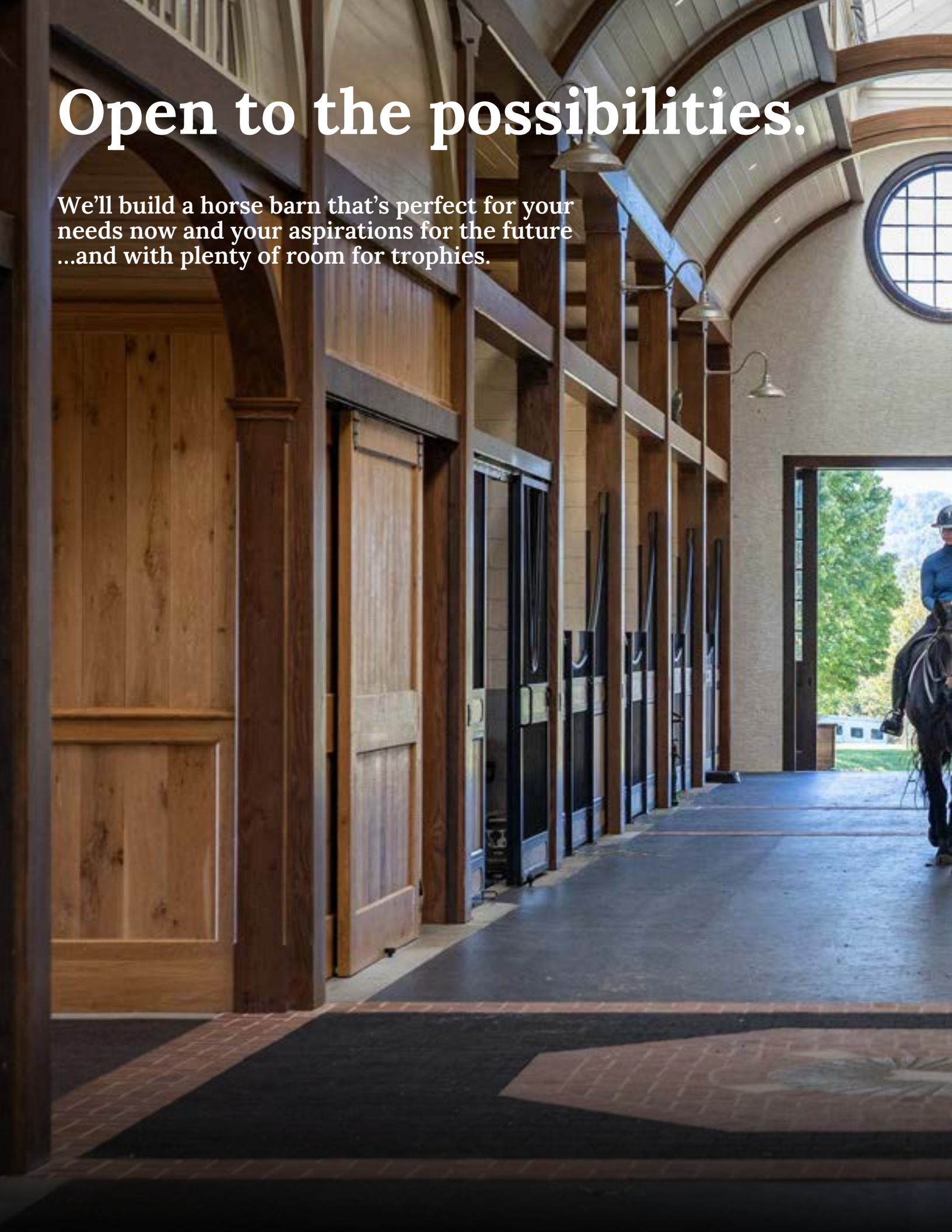

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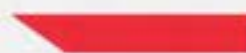
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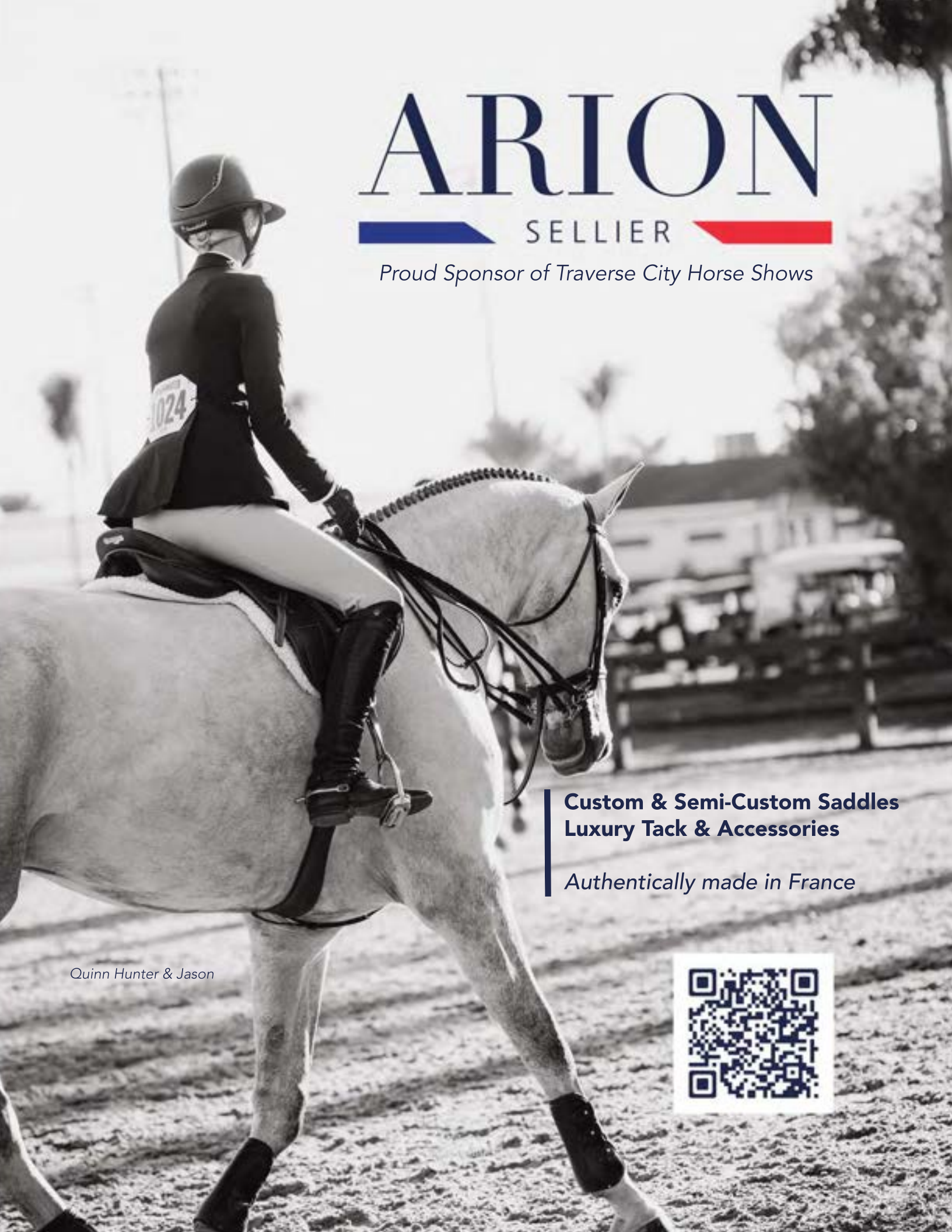

Horses entered in the International Jumper Division may also enter any jumper class for which they are eligible one hour prior to the horse inspection each week. There will be no nomination fee for the class to enter.

Pre-Vet Inspections All horses have to be pre-checked by the VD or VSM before entering to the FEI stables and complete the registration of the temperature of the horse for three days before arrival in the Horse App, from the opening of the stables until one hour prior to the horse inspection. The pre-check will be held from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, arrivals after hours must be scheduled with the VD.

FEI HorseApp Horse Health Requirements: In accordance with Art. 1029 and 1031 of the FEI 2026 Veterinary Regulations, as of 1 January 2026, ALL Horses competing at ALL FEI Events must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp.

Inspections: All horses will be presented for the veterinary examination & horse inspections as noted in the weekly Definite Schedules in the FEI stabling compound.

Stabling and Schooling: All horses entered in these classes are required to be on grounds AND stabled in the official FEI stable compound for pre inspection prior to the start of their veterinary inspection of the week they are competing. All horses from this point forward are required to wear their assigned back number whenever leaving the official FEI stable compound. Horses may be schooled only during posted schooling times and in designated schooling areas. FEI equipment rules apply. Horse boot and leg inspections will take place with no prior notice to the athlete.

Drug Rules: Conducted under FEI Medication and treating rules and procedures.

Eligibility:

- All horses must be registered with the USHJA and recorded with the USEF pursuant to USEF GR1102, in good standing under USEF rules.
- All athletes must be a current active USEF and USHJA member in good standing from the time of application until conclusion of the event.
- All horses must be age verified as required in accordance with the Federation Policies and Procedures (JP117).
- Exception: Foreign residents and horses in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in the Championship but must be age verified with USEF in accordance with the Federation Policies and Procedures (JP117).
- National and Zone Horse of the Year (HOTY) bonus points will only be awarded if the owner is a current active USEF and USHJA member and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA.
- The burden of proof of eligibility to compete will be the sole responsibility of the owner or the athlete, and not of the USHJA.
- Horses must be enrolled to be eligible for the USHJA Young Jumper Championships.
- All horses must be microchipped.
- Horses who have qualified in their age category for a Young Jumper Championship outside the United States, e.g., the World Breeding Championship for Young Jumping Horses, the German Young Horse Championships, upon verification by USEF, will also be eligible to compete.

Qualification

- 5-, 6-, and 7-Year-Old horses will qualify for their respective Championship by competing in one class in a USEF Young Jumper section at USEF licensed competitions that are between January 1 and 24 hours prior to the first horse inspection at the Championship.
- 8-Year-Old horses will qualify for the Championship with one (1) clear rounds in classes at 1.30m or above held at USEF licensed competitions that are between January 1 and 24 hours prior to the first horse inspection at the Championship.
- Exception: foreign horses may qualify at competitions licensed by their national federation as long as those classes meet the requirements listed above. Foreign exhibitors must provide proof of results from their qualifying classes.
- 4-Year-Old horses are not required to qualify, but all horses are required to meet the eligibility requirement.

Championship Format

- Separate championships will be held for Four, Five, Six, Seven, and Eight Year Old horses. Each Championship will take place over four days to five (with a rest day between the Second Qualifier and the Final).
- All classes are conducted under USEF rules for Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse (JP117).
 - Four Year Old horses,
 - Eight Year-Old horses are required to comply with the boot specifications listed under USEF rules for Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse (JP117.2).
- Tack and Equipment for 5-8-Year-Olds:
 - 5-8-year-olds are required to follow USEF rule JP111.
- Course designers are allowed a 5cm discrepancy in jump height for any course set for the Championships.

- E. All horses must be on the grounds 24 hours before the start of the competition. Championship horses must remain on the horse show grounds through the completion of the Championship.
- F. All horses must present at the horse inspection for soundness before the First Qualifier.
- G. Horses competing in the Championship may not compete in any other classes at the host competition once they have passed the horse inspection until they have finished or withdrawn from the Championship.
- H. No horse that was eliminated in the First or Second Qualifier is eligible for the Final.
- I. Horses are allowed to return for the Second Qualifier if they are eliminated in the First Qualifier. Those horses are not allowed to compete in the Final Round and are not eligible for overall standings. If a rider elects not to return with a specific horse for the second qualifier, it is the responsibility of the rider to notify the Championship Liaison.
- J. In the event of horses being ridden by the same rider, the order of go for all rounds will be adjusted to separate those rides to the best of our ability.
- K. Rider Change Policy – if a rider is unable to continue to compete on a horse in any round of the competition due to extraordinary reasons, the rider and/or trainer must request permission from the Technical Delegate to change riders before the start of the next round of competition.

Scoring for 5-, 6-, 7-, and 8-Year-Old Horses and Tie Breakers

- A. Faults will be carried from each round (First Qualifier, Second Qualifier, and first round of the Final) to determine Overall Standings.
- B. Cumulative faults from the First and Second Qualifier determine the Overall Standings going into the Final.
- C. The Top 15 horses, including ties, with the least number of cumulative faults will return for the first round of the Final (Modified Table II 2a).
- D. Faults from the first round of the Final will be combined with cumulative faults for overall placings. All horses tied for first based on cumulative faults will jump off.
- E. 5-Year-Old ties below first will be broken by their time taken in the first round of the Final.
- F. 6-, 7-, and 8-Year-Old ties below first will be broken by their time taken in the Second Qualifier.
- G. Overall Standings after the Final will determine the overall winner and placings of each age category.

Overall Championship Awards

- A. Leading Young Jumper Awards
 - 1. Best U.S. Bred Horse – given to the highest placed U.S. bred horse in each age category.
 - 2. Young Jumper Grooms Award – given to the groom of the overall champion for each age category.
 - 3. Leading Owner – given to the owner with the highest placed horses across all age categories. If an owner has more than one horse in an age category, only their highest placed horse in the section will be considered. Ties will be broken by the number of overall champion horses for each owner, if a tie remains it will be broken by the number of overall reserve champion horses.
 - 4. Leading U.S. Breeder – given to the U.S. breeder with the highest placed horses across all age categories. If a breeder has more than one horse in an age category, only their highest placed horse in the section will be considered. Ties will be broken by the number of overall champion horses for each breeder, if a tie remains it will be broken by the number of overall reserve champion horses.
 - 5. Leading Young Jumper Rider – given to the rider with the highest placed horses across all age categories. If a rider has more than one horse in an age category, only their highest placed horse in the section will be considered. Ties will be broken by the number of overall champion horses for each rider, if a tie remains it will be broken by the number of overall reserve champion horses.
 - 6. Leading Young Jumper Trainer – given to the trainer with the highest placed horses across all age categories. If a trainer has more than one horse in an age category, only their highest placed horse in the section will be considered. Ties will be broken by the number of overall champion horses for each trainer, if a tie remains it will be broken by the number of overall reserve champion horses.
- B. Breeder's Cup Perpetual Trophy
 - 1. Given to the leading overall breeder, regardless of registry or nationality.
 - a. Eligibility: a breeder must have one horse in the top four Overall Standings in any age category for their horse(s) to count.
 - b. If a breeder has one horse in the top four, then all other horses will also count.
 - c. Points will be based on each horse's Overall Standings in their age category. Points will be scaled according to the number of horses who start in the First Round of each age category.

National and Zone HOTY Bonus Points

- National and Zone HOTY bonus points will be awarded in each phase of the Championship for the 5-, 6-, and 7-Year-Old sections. All horses and riders are eligible for Zone HOTY points regardless of whether the owner or rider resides within the zone where the Championship is held.
- A. All Horse of the Year points and money won will go to Channel I
 - B. For the First and Second Qualifiers conducted under Table II (Clear Round), all clear rounds will be tied for 1st and will receive 30 points. Second Qualifiers conducted under Table II, Section 1 will be placed 1st – 10th and points will be awarded as follows:
1st 30 points, 2nd 25 points, 3rd 20 points, 4th 15 points, 5th 10 points, 6th 5 points.
For the Final, points will be awarded as follows:
1st 60 points, 2nd 50 points, 3rd 40 points, 4th 30 points, 5th 20 points, 6th 10 points.

A. Tack & Equipment

1. Four Year Old horses are permitted to compete in standing or running martingales.
2. The use of Draw Reins, German Martingales, Chambons, or any other unconventional equipment are not permitted when jumping on competition grounds after the horse inspection until the completion of the Four Year Old Final.
3. Four Year Old horses must adhere to the boot specifications listed in the USEF Rulebook for Sections/Classes Restricted by Age of Horse (JP117.2)

B. Warm Up class is not scored.

C. Orders of Go: the First Qualifier order will be a random draw. The Final order will be the reverse order of scores from the First Qualifier. In the event of horses being ridden by the same rider, the order will be adjusted to separate those rides to the best of our ability.

D. A horse must complete one of the rounds in order to be eligible for overall standings.

401 Four Year Old First Qualifier and 402 Four Year Old Final (All horses who competed in the First Qualifier are eligible for the Final)

1. Simple courses with one double combination. a. First Qualifier height: 0.90m, b. Final height: 0.90-1.00m, c. Speed 300 m/m, d. Rounds conducted under Table II (Clear Round), e. 3. Champion and Reserve will be named according to total scores (Jumping and Style).

4. Ties in the First Qualifier will be broken by the highest jumping score. If a tie remains, then the highest style score from the First Qualifier will be used to break the tie. Should a tie remain, the horses will remain tied.

5. Ties in the Final for overall results will be broken by the highest cumulative jumping score (least cumulative faults) from the First Qualifier and the Final Round. If a tie remains, then the highest Style score from the Final Round will determine the Champion and Reserve. Should a tie remain, the horses will remain tied.

Hunter sections may be run as back-to-back classes at management's discretion (HU125). When classes are run back-to-back, exhibitors may perform both rounds before leaving the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise indicated. Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule HU126. Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, panels. Individual hunter classes may be entered for 20% of the prize money offered in that class unless otherwise specified.

In all rated hunter sections a numerical score will be given by the judges.

In all classes over obstacles, all horses being considered for an award must jog for soundness using either Option A or Option B below. Management must state in the competition prize list which method of jogging will be used. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge's decision regarding soundness is final.

Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.

Option B: Horses/ponies will be jogged together with the rider unmounted in the judge's order of preference. Two additional entries in addition to the number of ribbons must jog if there are sufficient entries. Horses/ponies may be asked to re-jog at the judge's discretion. A horse/pony may not leave the ring until the job has been declared official by the judge, or it will be eliminated. A horse that is unruly, one that breaks away from the handler or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, handler, other exhibitors or their entries will be eliminated. (Exception: Hunter Breeding and Pony Breeding). A horse may not be eliminated for receiving outside assistance in the jog. In classes restricted to ponies a junior must jog the pony for soundness.

Open to Junior Active Members of the Federation who have not yet reached their 18th birthday, on ponies 14.2 hands and under. No Junior over 12 years of age may compete on a small pony. No Junior over 14 years of age may compete on a medium pony. Application for membership can be made directly to the Federation, or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the Federation steward. Riders entered in this class cannot cross enter into a USEF Medal Class at the same competition. Suitability of a pony to rider will be emphasized. To be shown over a course of not less than six obstacles 2'3" for ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands; 2'6" for ponies over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 13.2 hands; and 3' for ponies over 13.2 hands. If distances between related fences are less than 100' (including in and outs), the distances must be adjusted for each height section. Two tests (EQ113 tests 1-17, excluding test 14) are required during the first round. Only one rider per pony. To fill a class three competitors must complete the course. Two cumulative refusals in the U.S. ffPony Medal Finals will result in elimination, see EQ111.1. This class may be judged as one class, with all height sections run consecutively; or management may elect to divide and pin this class in three separate sections, small, medium and large or to divide into two sections, small-medium and large or small and medium-large. When classes are divided as outlined above an exhibitor may only ride in one section per competition. (see EQ111.6)

4105 W.I.H.S. PONY MEDAL

Trophy & Eight Ribbons

To be shown over a course of not less than 8 jumps. No junior rider over 12 years of age may compete on a small pony. No junior rider over 14 years of age may compete on a medium pony. Certificate of Compliance - At Regional I, Regional II and Local Member competitions, National medal classes must be certified by the following: A course plan showing the actual height and spread of all the fences, signed by the judge and the course designer (the steward must sign if the course designer is not present on the competition grounds) which must be provided to the steward no later than the end of the competition day on which the national medal class is held. A Time Allowed will be used based on a speed of 360 yards per minute. The judge will give a numerical score for each competitor's round. The announcer will announce the judge's numerical score and then deduct time faults as follows: one point for each commenced second over the Time Allowed. Rules regarding Time to Start (JP136.3 and .4) and Starting and Stopping (JP137.1) will apply. A FINAL SCORE BELOW ZERO MAY NOT BE GIVEN.

Membership and Participation Requirements

- A. Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA to participate in this class. (see GR202).
 - B. Horses and ponies must be registered with USHJA to participate in this class.
 - C. Exception: Foreign residents and horses and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class but will not receive points unless they follow I.A. and I.B.
 - D. USHJA National and Zone HOTY bonus points will only be awarded if the owner is a current Active member of USEF and USHJA and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA.
 - E. Money won will only count for any USHJA National Hunter Derby standings or awards if the rider, owner and trainer are current Active members of USEF and USHJA, and the horse is registered with USHJA.
 - F. Competition management is required to run the class if there are twelve (12) or more entries. They may choose to run the class with twelve (12) or less entries.
 - G. The number of horses a rider can compete in a National Hunter Derby may be limited if so specified in the prize list.
 - H. The prize list may specify that in order to be eligible to compete in a National Hunter Derby, a horse must compete in one (1) or two (2) classes at the same competition.
 - I. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA International Hunter Derby at the same competition.
 - J. Competing in the USHJA National Hunter Derby does not qualify a horse or rider for the USHJA International Hunter Derby Championship.
 - K. Soundness -Horses entered in this class will NOT be required to jog for soundness. All horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the over fences phase listed below. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the authority to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the judges (GR1033.6).
 - a. Traditional Format – Horses must trot for soundness at the conclusion of the Classic Round. If the class is held over two days, horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of both Classic and Handy Rounds.
 - b. Hunt and Go Format – horses must trot for soundness at the conclusion of the Handy Round phase.
 - L. In accordance with HU 174.14 the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the National Hunter Derby.
- Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications. Due to inclement weather, competition management may excuse hunt coats or allow waterproof outerwear so long as the exhibitor's back number is worn correctly and visible.

Judging System

- A. Each class may have the option of having either one (1) or two (2) panels of judges. Each panel will consist of two (2) judges sitting together. One (1) judge on each panel must be a USEF "R" judge, the other judge on each panel may be either a USEF "R" or USEF "r" judge. Each panel will provide one (1) score for each round. See "E" for calculating the Overall Score. Management may choose to run a standard formatted Derby with fifteen (15) or fewer entries with one USEF (R) judge.
- B. No panel may award the same base score to any two (2) competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. A numerical score must be given and may be a duplicate score if it is under the cut-off.
- C. The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judge(s) base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- D. The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judge(s)' base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- E. Overall Score - The final score from each round (3'0" with 3'5" options) will be added to obtain the overall total for each horse.
- F. Hunt and Go - *Please note this Hunt and Go is judged differently than the International Hunter Derby Hunt and Go.

Tie Breaking Procedures

- A. No judge or panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score (before adding height bonus points) of that round.
- C. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
- D. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- E. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- F. Prior to the start of the class, if two judging panels are used, one panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the first round and another panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the second round. The tie breaking panel for the first round will also be designated as the tie breaking panel for the jump-off round.

Schooling

- A. During the two rounds of the National Hunter Derby, all horses entered must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Riders must wear their horse's Derby competition number while mounted. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their Derby competition number will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited.

USHJA NATIONAL HUNTER DERBY'S

Order of Go

- A. The order of go must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class.
- B. In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight horses (if available) separating multiple rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off ride occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.
- C. The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

Course Requirements

- A. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one (1) hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round is held at another time. In that case, the course for the second round must be posted a minimum of one hour prior. Hand walking is permitted prior to the National Hunter Derby class.
- B. Dotted lines are prohibited in both the first and second rounds of any National Hunter Derby.
- C. Jumps in ALL Rounds
 1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and course must offer a variety of Classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
 2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are allowed.
 3. A minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers.
 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 18" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of 8 feet on its front face
 6. The top element of all jumps must be in cups except for walls with movable bricks.
 7. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
 8. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies.
 9. Fence height 3'0"
 10. There must be four option fences set at 3'5". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting, less difficult track.

Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)

1. A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs.
3. At least one in and out
4. At least one bending line
5. At least one line with an unrelated distance
6. At least one long approach

Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)

1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.
2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs.
3. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'6" in height, halt and/or back. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
4. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

Competition Requirements

- A. A National Hunter Derby may be offered at USEF Licensed Channel I (Premier or National), or Channel II (Regional) rated competitions, or competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status.
- B. Competition Management will collect and remit to USHJA the \$35 per horse entrant fee at Channel I (Premier and National) rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status, and the \$25 per horse entrant fee at Channel II (Regional) competitions.
- C. Management may choose to offer a second USHJA National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs.
 1. Cross entry of horse between the two National Hunter Derbies is not permitted.
 2. The two (2) National Hunter Derbies may run concurrently or separate at the discretion of competition management.
 3. Prize money for each class must meet the minimum requirements outlined in Section X, as designated by the competition's rating.
 4. If there are twelve (12) or less entries in either class (National Hunter Derby and National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs), the two classes must be combined. When combined, the prize money must be equal or greater than the highest amount offered to any one (1) class prior to combining
 5. Once the National Hunter Derby is split Junior and Amateur riders may choose to compete in the Open Section.
- D. When there are (40) or more entries, the class may be split into two (2) separate classes. If there are fifty (50) or more entries, the class must be split into two (2) or three (3) separate classes. Management may determine a cutoff time for entering before splitting the National Hunter Derby. The cutoff time will be no earlier than 24 hours prior to the proposed start time of the National Hunter Derby. When the class is split, the original advertised prize money offered must be doubled, or tripled, and split in accordance to how many sections are offered.
 1. A two-way split will be offered as one Open section and one Restricted section for Juniors and Amateurs.
 - a. If there are fewer than twelve (12) entries in either the Open or Restricted section, then the original entry list will be split by a random draw into two equal sections.
 - b. Prize Money for a two-way split will be divided equally at 50% to each section.
 2. A three-way split will be offered as one Open section, one Junior section, and one Amateur section.
 - a. If there are fewer than twelve in any section, then a two-way split must be utilized.
 - b. Prize Money for a three-way split will be divided to each section as follows: 33% to the Open section, 33.5% to the Junior section, and 33.5% to the Amateur section.
 3. If there are fifty (50) or more entries in any section after the original split, then the section will be divided in half by a random draw and placed separately. Prize money must be divided equally at 50% to each new section. Management must adjust the entry fee according to the reduced prize money offered if the sections are split. If the sections are split but the entry fee is not reduced, then prize money must be doubled.
 4. Cross-entry of horses between the two (2) or three (3) National Hunter Derbies is not permitted.

Awards: Trophy to first, one set of Ribbons thru 12th place; prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%



2026 USHJA 3'3" ADULT JUMPING SEAT MEDAL FINALS SPECIFICATIONS

I. Qualifications to Compete

- A. USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal riders must be a current Amateur Active Members of USEF and USHJA who are 18 years of age or older.
- B. Foreign residents who are also members of USEF and USHJA will be eligible to compete.
- C. A rider is qualified to compete in the USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Finals when they have accumulated a minimum of ten (10) points in any USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal classes or completed three (3) or more USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal classes held from August 2 of the previous competition year through August 1 of the current competition year. The USHJA at its discretion can open up qualifying procedures to allow for additional entries to fill this championship, should insufficient entries be received by the deadline. Additional riders will be invited based on their points earned.
- D. A rider's competition record as a junior will not affect their eligibility.
- E. Riders are prohibited from competing in a USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Finals and a USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Finals in the same competition year.
- F. Any Adult rider 18 and over that has competed above 1.35m is prohibited from competing in a USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal class or Finals within that competition year.
- G. Any Adult rider aged 18-21 that has competed in a 3* USEF Show Jumping Talent Search class in the same competition year is no longer eligible to compete in a USHJA 3'3" Jumping Seat Medal class or Finals. The rider is automatically reinstated the following competition year.
- H. Riders must remain eligible through the completion of the finals.

II. Competition Format

The 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Finals will be composed of three (3) phases: Phase I (Flat Phase), Phase II (Gymnastics Phase) and Phase III (Jumping Phase).

If there are 50 or more entries, the final must be split into two sections (18 – 29, 30+). If the final is not split, additional awards will be given to those top riders in the 30+ age group.

- A. Phase I (Flat Phase): Flatwork with no more than twelve (12) riders at one time with all groups performing the same test. To be judged on rider's position, seat and the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Excellence and effectiveness on the flat will be rewarded. The performance begins when the class is called to order. Riders will show in both directions as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, and the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders shall be required to show at the working canter on the counter lead in both directions. Judges may require any additional tests on the flat (see EQ113). In addition, basic dressage movements may be tested including but not limited to Shoulder-in, Shoulder-out, Haunches-in, and Haunches-out. The starting order of Phase I will be assigned by a random draw. All ties will be randomly drawn within that placing to determine the Phase II order.
- B. Phase II (Gymnastics Phase):
 - 1. Fences shall be set between .85-.95m
 - 2. Phase II exercises may include trot fences, not to exceed .85m. Placing rails, trotting rails and cavalettis are prohibited.
 - 3. Rails knocked down will be treated more leniently than in the Phase III (Jumping Phase). Phase II will have a multiplier of 1.5.
 - 4. The start order of Phase II will go in order of scores received in Phase I from lowest to highest.
- C. Phase III (Jumping Phase): Must be held in a jumper ring utilizing jumper style fences.
 - 1. To be shown over a course of ten (10) to twelve (12) numbered obstacles set at a height of 1.0m with spreads up to 1.10m (triple bar up to 1.15m).
 - 2. To include: one (1) double combination and one (1) triple combination, or three (3) double combinations.

3. The course must also include a dry, above-ground Liverpool.
 4. Time allowed will be calculated at 350 meters per minute.
 5. The course will be posted and open thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the competition.
 6. Two cumulative refusals will incur elimination.
 7. Rails down will result in a deduction of four (4) points from the riders' score, time faults in a deduction of one (1) point for each second commenced over the time allowed.
 8. **If as a result of a disobedience a competitor displaces or knocks down any obstacle or a flag marking the limits of the water jump, of a natural obstacle or in all cases where the nature of the obstacle is changed by knocking down the flag, the tone is sounded and the time is stopped until the obstacle has been rebuilt. When the obstacle has been rebuilt, the tone is sounded to indicate that the course is ready and that the competitor can continue the round. The competitor is penalized for a refusal and a time correction of 6 seconds is added to the time taken by the competitor to complete their round. The time is restarted at the moment when the horse leaves the ground at the obstacle where the refusal occurred.**
 9. Phase III will have a multiplier of two (2). The start order of Phase III will be the reverse order of standings after Phases I and II. Ties will be broken by the score from Phase II.
- D. A work off is required for all riders within three (3) points of the leader following the completion of Phase III. The work off will consist of a shortened course with a time allowed calculated at 375m/minute. Scores will not be announced for this phase. Ties will be broken by the score from Phase III (Jumping Phase).

III. **Competition Schedule**

- A. Schedule
 1. Jog (prior to start of Phase I)
 2. Phase I (Flat)
 3. Phase II (Gymnastics)
 4. Phase III (Jumping)
 5. Work off (if needed)
- B. If needed, Competition Management is permitted to schedule the 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Finals over two (2) days.
- C. Jog Format:
 1. All horses entered in the USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Final must jog for soundness during the Official Jog prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Jog must be held within 24 hours of the start of the first round. This jog will be run in a manner similar to an FEI jog.
 2. A horse must be officially entered in the class before it will be allowed to jog. **All horse entries, including substitutes, must be entered in the class before the show office closes, the day prior to the Official Jog.**
 3. Proper attire is required. In addition, Juniors are required to wear protective headgear.
 4. All horses must be presented at the Official Jog with their competition number and wearing a bridle, including noseband.
 5. The judging panel for the Official Jog shall consist of the competition veterinarian and a minimum of one competition judge.
 6. The jog surface must be level. Similar to an FEI Veterinary Inspection, horses shall be evaluated going directly away and back from the veterinarian and judge, after which, upon the recommendation of the veterinarian, the participating judge will decide if the horse passes.
 7. If a horse does not pass the jog; the exhibitor may request to re-present the horse. The judge(s) may decide to allow the horse to re-present at any time up to one hour prior to the start of the class. The veterinarian and one of the judges from the original panel must be present. In this case, the decision of the participating judge is final and not subject to appeal.

IV. **Tack**

- A. Refer to rule EQ106.5b.
- B. In Phase I, martingales are prohibited.
- C. In Phases II and III, only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. Standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are prohibited.

V. **Schooling**

- A. Horses must be present on the competition grounds for a minimum of twelve (12) hours before the start of the finals.
- B. Trainers/Coaches are permitted to ride and school competitor's horses.
- C. Trainers/Coaches are permitted to walk Phases II and III with the competitors.

VI. Judges and Judging Procedures

- A. See GR1304 for Judging restrictions.
- B. The USHJA 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Finals will be judged by a panel of two (2) "R" or Registered Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation Division judges. One of the "R" registered judges must be approved by the USHJA Equitation Task Force prior to the final.
- C. Both judges will sit together for the duration of the class and provide one (1) numerical score for each competitor in each phase. A qualified scribe must be provided by the competition.
- D. Open numeric scoring will be used in Phases I- III, and not in the work off phase.
- E. Riders must compete on the same horse in all phases; no substitution of horse is allowed.

VII. Awards

- A. Ribbons will be awarded to 1st -12th place for each phase and for overall placings, overall placings will be given to each age group if the final is split. The presentation of awards is to be given in reverse order.
- B. In event of one section, 1st – 12th place will be awarded for overall placings, with the addition of 1st – 3rd place ribbons awarded to those top riders in the 30+ age group.
- C. The Overall Champion will be presented with a rider sash, horse cooler, and a sponsor award if available.
- D. Recognition shall be given for the Best Horse. This shall be awarded to the horse deemed by the judges to be the best and most suitable 3'3" Adult Jumping Seat Medal Finals horse.

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Road to the Top Jumper Challenge 2026

Class 4300

This document outlines the concept for a new equestrian jumping competition specifically designed for young equestrians to showcase their style and skill in the jumper ring.

The Jumper Challenge is aimed at equestrians who are actively pursuing a career in the equestrian industry.

This competition offers individuals a platform to demonstrate their skills, acquire valuable competition experience, and build connections with peers, sponsors, and prospective employers. It also serves as an opportunity for RTTT to increase awareness of the program, to provide a revenue source, and to identify and recruit athletes.

Class Restrictions/Specifications

The Traverse City Horse Shows competition is open to riders under the age of 25.
The LA Equestrian Center competition is open to riders under the age of 30.

Class Format

The competition will be run as a Table II, 2b jumper class format at 1.15m.

This height is challenging enough to test experienced riders and horses but is also accessible for those who are building their careers without being overly demanding on younger professional prospects or less experienced horses. Depending on the success of the initial event, additional classes at slightly different heights may be introduced in future iterations.

Class Conditions

This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.15m in a Table II, 2b format.

A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized.

Standing and running martingales ARE permitted

Draw reins and German martingales are NOT permitted

Course Design

Courses will be designed to be technically demanding, incorporating various types of obstacles including:

- Verticals
- Oxers
- Triple bars
- Combinations (doubles and triples)
- Liverpool
- Open water for extra points (+2) (if available)
- The time allowed will be a significant factor

Judging Criteria

- The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2b format with jumping and time faults being calculated.
- The class will be judged by two R licensed officials, one with a hunter/equitation license and one with a jumper license.
- The jumper judge will assess jumping and time faults.
- The equitation judge will award a score based on technical skill and style of riding. This score will break the tie for the riders who have an equality of faults in their jumping score.
- At the completion of the first round all riders with CLEAR rounds (no jumping or time faults) AND an equitation score of 75 or better will immediately (after the tone) complete the jump off/work off shortened course.
- The equitation judge's score for a rider's jump off round is ADDED to his or her first-round score. The rider with the least faults and the highest cumulative score is the winner.
- Two refusals will incur elimination.
- The open numerical scoring system will be used, and jumping faults and the judge's equitation score will be announced after each round. There is no need to deduct the time and jumping faults from the numerical score. The judge can do that on their card if they wish but it will not be announced. Just the jumping/time faults and the tie breaking judge's score will be announced.
- The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined by the rider with the least number of faults and the highest judge's score.

Previous winners of the THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championship 18-24 who have reached the age of 25 or over may compete in any THIS NHS Medal classes, Area Championships, as well as the THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championship 25 and Over. Previous winners of the THIS NHS Equitation Championship 25 and Over are ineligible to compete in any THIS NHS Adult Medal, Area Championships, or the Finals.

Riders must have been 2025 members (September 1, 2024 – August 31, 2025) of the National Horse Show Association ("NHSAA") to compete in the THIS NHS Adult Area Championship. Trainers (or coaches when applicable [see USEF GR108]) of riders competing in all THIS Adult Medal Classes, Area Championships, and Finals must also be members of the NHSAA. The NHSAA Membership year is September 1 through August 31. Adult rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer (or coach) annual contributions shall be \$50. A rider may enter any NHS Adult Medal anywhere in the United States according to the conditions published in the current Rule book of the USEF.

Judging

Specifications for all Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes, Area Championships and Finals

The Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes, Area Championships and Finals are open only to junior members of the USEF who have not reached their 18th birthday in accordance with GR127 and who have never competed in any of the following National Equitation Finals with fences at 3'6" or higher: ASPCA Maclay Finals, US Medal Finals, USEF Talent Search (East or West), WIHS Equitation Classic Finals, Jump Canada Medal Finals or the North American Equitation Championship. Riders who compete in a Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Class may show in the ASPCA Maclay and in any other classes for which they are eligible at the same horse show. Riders may not show in both the Hamel Foundation National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship and the ASPCA Maclay Finals in the same competition year. Previous winners of the Hamel Foundation National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship are ineligible to compete in any Hamel Foundation NHS Medal Class, Area Championship, or the Finals.

Riders must have been 2025 members (September 1, 2024 – August 31, 2025) of the National Horse Show Association ("NHSAA") to compete in the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Area Championship. Trainers (or coaches when applicable [see USEF GR108]) of riders competing in all Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes, Area Championships and Finals must also be members of the NHSAA. The NHSAA Membership year is September 1 through August 31. Junior rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer (or coach) annual contributions shall be \$50. A rider may enter any Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes anywhere in the United States according to the conditions published in the current Rule book of the USEF. NHS 3'3" Medal points can be earned at any USEF licensed competition. Any rider in his or her final junior year may not compete in any Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Classes held at a competition with a start date after August 31 of that competition year.

Judging

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse. After completion of the jumping phase a minimum of twelve (12) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible. Only riders who have completed the course and competed in the flat phase may receive ribbons. Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used.

Conditions for Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Area Championship Classes:

- Only competitions recognized by the USEF are eligible to hold the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Area Championship Classes.
- Only one rider per horse.
- The same horse must be used for all Rounds/Phases of the competition.
- Two refusals will eliminate a rider from competition.
- Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5a. Martingales not permitted for the flat phase.
- To fill a Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Area Championship Class three (3) competitors must complete the course.
- A Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Area Championship may not be run using a California split.

Qualifying for Hamel Finals at the Area Championship:

The Champion, Reserve Champion and Third place finisher from each Area Championship, if not otherwise qualified, will receive invitations to compete in the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Equitation Finals provided they have points from competing in Hamel classes in the same competition year.

6005 ASPCA Maclay Regional Championship - Region 4

**** PLEASE NOTE: Membership in the National Horse Show Association (NHSAA) is required for all riders and trainers who have riders competing in the ASPCA Maclay. The membership/qualifying year is September 1 – August 31. ****

The National Horse Show Association of America, Limited ("NHSAA") is responsible for the organization, presentation and administration of the Maclay Trophy and the associated competitions, including the Maclay Regional Championship ("Regionals") and Maclay National Championship ("Finals") Classes. To ensure the selection of appropriate sites, judges and course designers, the NHSAA communicates with the Joint Equestrian Task Force of the United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA), the National Horse Show Association Equestrian Committee and on other matters with the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals ("ASPCA"). USEF rules govern these competitions and the Maclay National Championship Qualifying Classes ("Maclay"). In case of any conflict between these Rules and USEF rules, USEF rules shall govern.

6005 Entries and Entry Closing Dates for Regionals - Entry Fee \$150

Entries for Regional Maclay Championship classes close, and must be received by, 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time, September 1, at the NHSAA's office. All entries must be submitted electronically with the \$150.00 per class fee.

Entries are to be submitted on-line at <https://entries.showmanagementsystem.com>. The NHSAA reserves the right to reject any late, unsigned or entries not submitted with all entry fees.

Specifications

- All riders wishing to compete in the Finals must qualify for the Regionals based on the state point requirement of their own official rider point state of residence with the USEF.
- Riders may compete in a total of fourteen (14) Maclay classes in a single qualifying period. Any rider who continues to compete after they have competed in fourteen (14) Maclay classes will no longer be eligible to compete in the Regionals or the Finals (Exception: If a rider is not yet qualified for the Regionals of their official rider point state of residence with the USEF after fourteen (14) Maclay classes, that rider may continue to compete until qualified. Any rider that has already competed in their fourteen (14) Maclay classes must stop competing in Maclay classes as soon as they are qualified, or they will no longer be eligible to compete in any Regionals or the Finals.).
- It is the rider's responsibility to calculate and know their points as well as the number of classes in which they have competed.
- The qualifying period for each year's Regionals ends August 31. If a horse show starts on or before August 31, Maclay points acquired at that show will count towards the current year.
- With the Maclay Regionals following the Hamel Area Championship, there will be no cross entry of horse/rider combinations allowed and no horses competing in the regional may compete in either of the preceding area championship class.
- No horse may compete in any class taking place the same day in the same ring as the regional class. Riders may compete in classes the same day in the same ring prior to the regional class on a different horse, but their regional competition horse may not.
- Flat riding in the competition ring prior to the Regional Championship is left to the discretion of competition management. If the Regional course is set prior to flatting, then the jumps will be disassembled to allow for movement.

Courses for all Maclay, Regionals and Finals Classes

To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles.

Course must include:

- One combination (including an oxer)
- At least two changes of direction after the first obstacle
- At least three of the following
 - Bending Line
 - Narrow Jump (5'6"-8')
 - Roll back turn
 - Fence at the end of the ring
 - Long approach to a single jump
- 1/3 of the obstacles must be oxers
- Obstacle height to be set at 3'6"
- Maximum width of oxers 4'
- Maximum width of triple bars and hogs backs 5'
- Liverpools, water jumps or water used as decoration are prohibited
- Banks, ditches, grobs and other natural obstacles are prohibited.

Course

The course for each Regionals shall be designed by a USEF Course Designer who must be selected and/or approved by the NHSAA. Any Regionals course must adhere to the above stated specifications and be of sufficient difficulty to typify the Finals and reflect the importance of the class. While the courses at all Regionals need not be identical, they should reflect equal difficulty and challenge.

Judging

Each Regionals shall have two (2) "R" Judges. It is requested that one of these judges be selected from the approved list of judges supplied by the NHSAA. The second judge is not required to be selected from this list. Judges for the Finals are ineligible to judge any Regionals in the same year.

Riders are to be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse.

Two refusals will eliminate a rider from Regionals competition.

Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used.

After completion of the jumping phase, a minimum of twelve (12) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. At the sole discretion of the judges, additional flat work may be called for, but all groups must be asked to perform the same tests. No more than twenty (20) riders at a time may be asked to work together in a group. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible.

No score below a 60 may be invited back to compete on the flat. All scores of 60 and above will return to compete in the flat phase. All those returning to flat must be pinned in order of judges' preference.

After the flat phase the Judges may request further testing using USEF tests 1-23.

The Judges will select a Champion, Reserve Champion, and Third through Tenth place finishers at each Regionals.

When the Regionals are completed and the riders qualified for the Finals have been selected the judge's cards will be immediately sealed. The judge's cards and a detailed copy of the course diagram will be emailed directly to the NHSAA office.

In accordance with GR 1111.4: Canada, IA, WI, MO, TN, VA, WV, PA, NJ are contiguous states.

JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS:

To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION:

To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections

Cross Entry Riders: Riders entered in Adult Amateur Hunter sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (exception: Equitation, Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Amateur Owner Hunter, Amateur Owner Jumper classes, and the USHJA International Hunter Derby). Riders competing in the Amateur Owner Hunter or Amateur Owner Jumper sections may compete on one different horse in the Adult Amateur Hunter section.

Horses: Horses cannot cross enter into 3'3" or 3'6" Amateur Owner sections at the same competition. Horses may only compete in one age group per competition.

Horse and Rider Combination: n/a

Fence Height: 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height. Courses will not be adjusted for ponies. Combinations will be permitted.

Combining/Dividing Sections: May be split into three sections when offered by age:

Adult Amateurs 18– 35, Adult Amateurs 36– 49, Adult Amateurs 50 & over

Adult Amateur Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than four (4) entries in a section. Adult Amateur Hunter and Children's Hunter may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section. Under Saddle Classes: If an under saddle class is divided by age and a rider has two (2) or more horses entered, all riders must be amateurs but need not be eligible by age.

Handy Hunter Classes: Handy Hunter Classes are optional and can be added at the competition management's discretion.

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry

Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where the fences exceed 3' (Exception: All Age Group Equitation Classes) Riders who compete in the 3' Adult Amateur Hunter Section may show one horse in the Low Adult Amateur Hunter Section.

Horse and Rider Combination:

Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes or section where the fences exceed 2'9" at the same competition. (Exception: All Age Group Equitation)

Fence Height: •2'6"

Combining/Dividing Sections: The Low Adult Amateur Hunter and Low Children's Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than four (4) entries in either section.

AMATEUR JUMPER

Sections offered and requirements: • 1.00m Amateur Jumper • 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper

Cross Entry: Rider: 1.00m Amateur Jumper riders may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m at the same competition. Amateur Jumper riders may not cross enter into High Amateur Owner classes or any other jumper class exceeding 1.30m at the same competition with the exception of classes which do not offer prize money (including add back money) see GR141 and JP119 for cross entry restrictions.

Horse/Pony: No cross-entry restrictions

Horse and Rider Combination: 1.00m Amateur Jumper horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumpers at the same competition.

1.10/1.15m Amateur horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the 1.00m Amateur Jumpers at the same competition.

Fence Height: • Amateur Jumper 1.00m • Amateur Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Juniors with Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections:

• 1.00m Amateur Jumper • 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: ADULT SECTION Refer to GR1131

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Sections offered and requirements: Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under, Children's Hunter Horse 15- 17

Cross Entry: Rider: A Children's Hunter Horse rider may only compete one different horse in the Junior Hunter Sections. Riders entered in Children's Hunter Horse sections may not compete in any other class in which obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (exception: Equitation classes up to 3'9", Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Junior Hunter sections and USHJA International Hunter Derby).

A Junior Hunter rider may only compete one different horse in the Children's Hunter Horse section.

Riders entered in the Children's Hunter Horse section may only compete on one Children's Hunter

Pony at the same competition.

Horses/Ponies: Horses entered in Children's Hunter classes may not cross enter into Junior Hunter sections at the same competition. Horses may only compete in one age group per competition.

Horse and rider combination: n/a

Fence Height: 3'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. Combinations will be permitted

Combining/Dividing Sections: Children's Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than four (4) entries in a section. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. Adult Amateur Hunter and Children's Hunter may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in either section.

Handy Hunter Classes are optional and can be added at the Competition Management's discretion.

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry: Riders:

Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where the fences exceed 3' (Exception: All Age Group Equitation Classes) Riders who compete in the 3' Children's Hunter Horse Section may show one horse in the Low Children's Hunter Horse Section.

Horse and Rider Combination:

Low Children's Hunter Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any classes or section where the fences exceed 2'9" at the same competition. (Exception: All Age Group Equitation)

Fence Height: •2'6"

Combining/Dividing Sections: The Low Children's Hunter section and the Low Adult Amateur Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than four (4) entries in either section.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Sections offered and requirements: Small/Medium Children's Pony, Large Children's Pony

Prize Money: No minimum prize money is required.

Cross Entry: Rider:

Age restrictions in the regular pony sections do not apply. Riders may only show one children's pony when showing multiple ponies in the Regular or Green Pony Sections. Or if a rider is showing multiple ponies in the children's pony section then they can only show one pony in the Regular or Green Pony Section.

Horse and Rider Combination:

The same pony/rider combination may not show in the green or Regular pony Section at the same show.

Fence Height: Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0" with spreads not to exceed height of fence; Large Ponies: 2'6" with spreads not to exceed height of fence. • In and outs will not be permitted

• Distances for this section should be set on the 12-foot stride.

Combining/Dividing Sections: Children's Hunter Pony sections may be combined with Children's Hunter Horse sections if there are fewer than four (4) entries in a section. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. The Children's Hunter Pony may be divided by height (small/medium and large). If there are four (4) or more entries in each height section, the sections must be held separately.

Suggested Distances: At management's discretion, Children's Hunter Pony may choose to run the section as follows using the suggested distance guidelines:

a. 2'0" Small Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on 9'9" stride): 4 strides at 48'9"; 5 strides at 58'6"; 6 strides at 68'3"; 7 strides at 78'8"; 8 strides at 87'9".

b. 2'3" Medium Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on a 10'3" stride): 4 strides at 51'3"; 5 strides at 61'6"; 6 strides at 71'9"; 7 strides at 82'; 8 strides at 92'3".

c. 2'6" Large Children's Hunter Pony should be (based on an 11' stride): 4 strides at 55'; 5 strides at 66'; 6 strides at 77'; 7 strides at 88'; 8 strides at 99'.

JUNIOR JUMPER

Sections offered and Requirements: • 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper • 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper

Cross Entry: Rider: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumpers riders may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m at the same competition.

1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper riders may not cross enter into High Junior classes or any other jumper class exceeding 1.30m at the same competition with the exception of classes which do not offer prize money (including add back money) see HU141 and HU137 for cross entry restrictions.

Horse/Pony No cross entry restrictions

Horse and Rider Combination: 1.00/1.05m Junior horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumpers at the same competition. 1.10/1.15m Junior horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumpers at the same competition.

Fence Height: • Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m • Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m

Combining/Dividing Sections: Sections may be divided by age of rider and may also be combined (Junior's with Adult Amateur sections) if so stated in the prize list.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section:

• 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper section • 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper section

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: CHILDREN'S/JUNIOR SECTION: Refer to GR1131

2026 GUIDELINES FOR COMBINING AND DIVIDING HUNTER SECTIONS

Performance Hunter and High Performance Hunter.

a. Number to hold separate sections: Performance: four (4) and High Performance: three (3). If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.

b. Combining

1. At all licensed competitions, if there are fewer than four entries in either the Performance Hunter 3'3" or Performance Hunter 3'6" they must be combined, but they cannot be combined with any other Hunter sections, except High Performance Hunter. If there are four or more entries in each Performance Hunter section, they must be held separately. If the Performance Hunter 3'6" and the Performance Hunter 3'3" sections have fewer than three entries after they have been combined they may be further combined with the High Performance Hunter section.

2. If there are fewer than three entries in the High Performance Hunter section it must first be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section or the Green Hunter 3'9" section (or with Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" if offered combined). If the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section it may then further be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'3" section, but may not be combined with the Green Hunter section(s).

3. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter section the following applies:

a. When combining High Performance Hunter with Performance Hunters, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Performance Hunter section(s) with which it is combined.

b. When combining High Performance Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

4. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:

a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section

b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must be combined with High Performance Working Hunter.

c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section.

d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section.

f. The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections.

c. Dividing:

1. In Performance Hunter, High Performance Hunter and any other sections where individual classes may be entered, the sections may only be divided after thirty (30) horses have competed in the first over fences class. Subsequent classes may be divided once twelve (12) horses have competed in each class. For Championships, see HU154.

Green Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3).

b. Combining:

1. Green Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other hunter section(s). (Exception: The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" and 3'9" sections, see HU164.1)

2. Regardless of competition rating, each Green Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries.

3. If there are fewer than three entries in a Green Hunter section, that section must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter.

4. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter.

5. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two non-contiguous fence height sections may be combined.

6. If Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'0" and/or 3'3" sections are combined with Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and/or Green Hunter 3'9" sections a Handy Hunter class is not required. The combined sections must meet class number requirements for Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and Green Hunter 3'9" and use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

7. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:

a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section

b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must be combined with High Performance Working Hunter.

c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section.

d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section.

f. The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections.

c. Dividing:

1. Regardless of competition rating, any Green Hunter section that is offered combined must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a

minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or as one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections.

Young Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3). b. Combining:

1. Young Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other Hunter section.

2. At Competition Management's discretion, and with at least three (3) Young Hunters entered in any section, the Young Hunter Section(s) may run concurrently with the corresponding Green Hunter height section or Combined Green Hunter Section. Horses that are entered in both the Young Hunter and Green Hunter section(s) will be eligible for awards in both sections. Horses that are not entered in both sections will only be eligible for awards in the section in which they are entered. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in any of the Young Hunter section(s) they must be combined for awards per HU166.3. A separate entry fee for the Young Hunter Section will apply. The Green Hunter section requirements by rating listed in HU166.2 will still apply.

3. Regardless of competition rating, each Young Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in a Young Hunter section that section must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two non-contiguous fence height sections may be combined.

c. Dividing:

1. Regardless of competition rating, any Young Hunter section that is offered as a combined section must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections.

Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" and High Performance Conformation Hunter a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3).

b. Combining:

1. The Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" may only be combined with the High Performance Conformation Hunter. The High Performance Conformation Hunter may only be combined with the Green Conformation Hunter 3'6".

2. When offered as two sections, if there are fewer than three (3) horses in either the Green Conformation 3'6" or the High Performance Conformation section they must be combined.

3. When combining Green Conformation Hunter with High Performance Conformation Hunter, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined section will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

c. Dividing: If there are three (3) or more horses in each Conformation section they must be held separately.

Junior Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: four (4) in each section. If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.

b. Combining:

1. The Junior Hunter 3'6", Junior Hunter 3'3", Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6", and Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3" sections may only be combined with other Junior Hunter or Amateur Owner Hunter sections.

See below for conditions.

2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, Competition Management may choose to combine the sections. The Competition Management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ122). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count.

3. It is recommended that when competitions anticipate 50 horses or more this section be divided by age of rider or height of horse when prize list is prepared.

c. Dividing:

1. When divided, sections must be split using one of the methods from HU161 Methods of Dividing.

2. If there are 50 or more entries in the section at the beginning of the first class it must be divided and the prize money must be doubled.

3. If there are 50 or more entries remaining in a section after it has been divided, the section must be redivided and the prize money must be doubled. Once a section has been redivided it may be divided further if management so desires.

4. If the Junior Hunter sections are divided by height of animal, they must be divided into Large and Small. Premier rated Junior Hunter 3'6" sections at Premier rated competitions must be offered as four sections (large/younger, large/older, small/younger, small/older).

5. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in any sections divided by age and/or height of animal, those sections must be combined with other sections. If there is a minimum of twelve (12) entries once any sections have been combined, the newly combined section must be redivided.

Amateur Owner Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: four (4) in each section. If four (4) compete and only three (3) complete (i.e. one is eliminated or retires) points will be awarded as per GR 1113.

b. Combining:

1. The Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6", Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3", Junior Hunter 3'6", and Junior Hunter

3'3" sections may only be combined with other Amateur Owner Hunter or Junior Hunter sections.

See below for conditions.

2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, competition management may choose to combine the sections. The competition management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ121). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count.

3. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, these sections may be combined. The competition management may choose to combine the classes as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered.

c. Dividing:

1. Amateur Owner 3'6" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either divided section, they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be redivided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU162 & HU160 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on the entry blank.

When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

2. Amateur Owner 3'3" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in either divided section, they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be re-divided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU164 & HU162 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on entry blank. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

Pony Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3). b. Combining:

1. The Regular Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections.

2. Height sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) in any height section. Combined

height sections should be either small/medium or medium/large but if possible not small/large. c. Dividing:

1. Classes for Pony Hunters may be divided by height of pony as outlined in HU141.

2. If there are 50 or more entries in the division at the beginning of the first class, it must be divided by height of pony and prize money must be doubled.

3. If there are 50 entries remaining in a section after the section has been divided by height of pony, the section must be re-divided by every other number and the prize money must be doubled.

4. Once a section has been re-divided it may not be divided further.

5. If a pony under saddle class has over 30 entries, the class must be split and held in at least two sections with one set of awards.

6. If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height Section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); if there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled.

Green Pony Hunter

a. Number to hold separate sections: three (3) per section. b. Combining:

1. The Green Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections.

2. Green Pony Hunter Sections at National and Premier rated competitions may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in any height section. c. Dividing:

1. National and Premier rated competitions must split (small, medium and large) if there are four (4) or more entries in any height section.

2. If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); prize money need not be doubled. If there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled.

Adult Amateur Hunter

a. Competitions must offer Adult Amateur Hunter sections in accordance with the specifications of each USHJA Zone.

b. Notice of the use of a floating split and the age groups must be posted at the competition office. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. Age must be given on entry blank. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

Children's Hunter

a. Children's Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications

Low Adult Hunter

a. Low Adult Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications.

Low Children's Hunter

a. Low Children's Hunter sections must be combined or divided in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications.

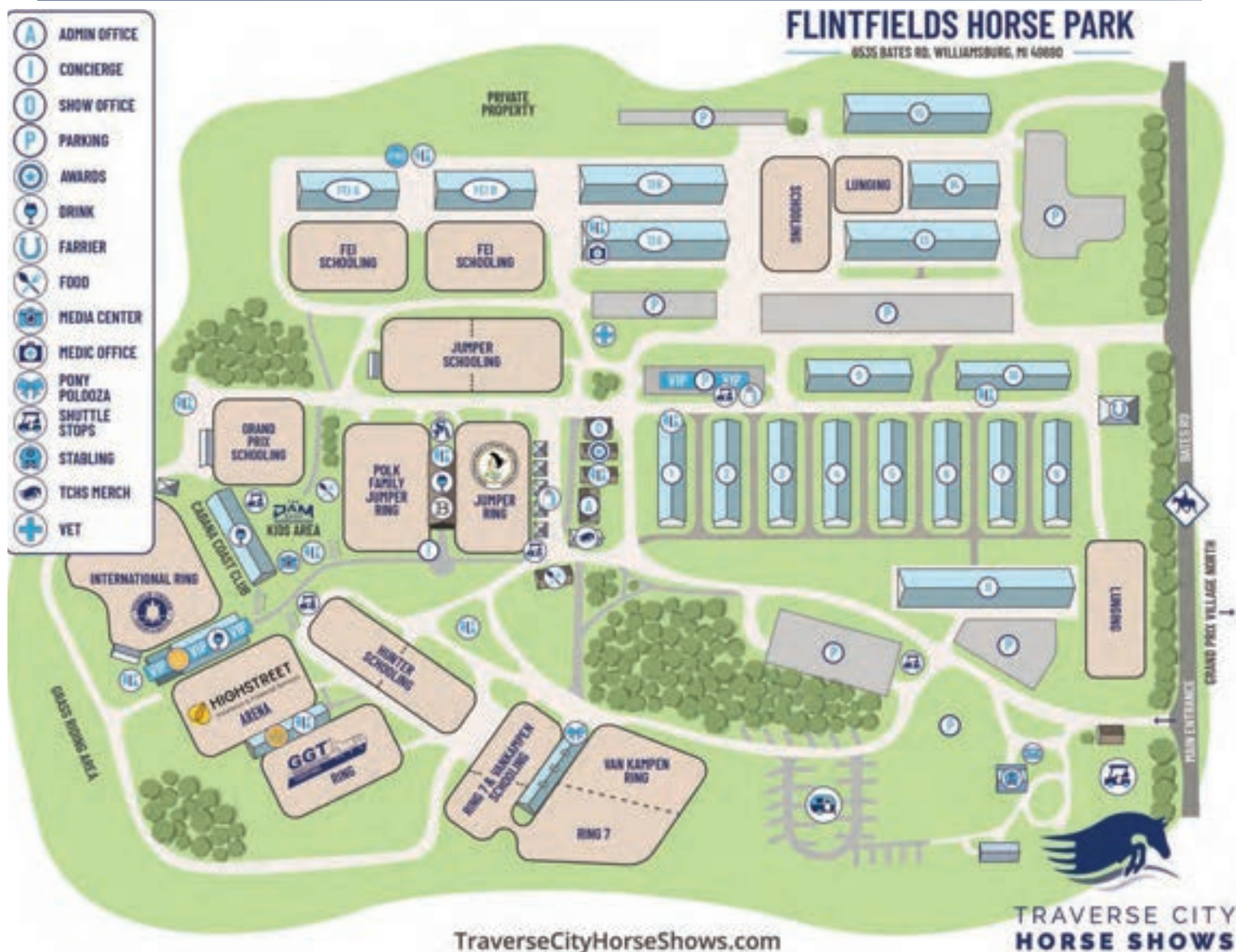

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book and FEI Rules, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. **LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE, COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, ENDURANCE RIDES AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS: (SEE GR828.4 OF THE FEDERATION RULES).** LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, OR AGENT, AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES

Federation Entry Agreement - By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors, and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right to publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchip HU104: As of December 1, 2017, all horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration **must provide a microchip number** that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered.

A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal.

This rule will have a transition period from December 1, 2017 to November 30, 2018. During this period, animals that are not in compliance with this rule will not receive points or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards. After this period, all horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions. Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9.

2. ENTRIES:

- a) Entries open immediately upon publication of this prize list. The closing dates for entries will be August 19, 2026.
- b) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC requires that nomination fees, hunter, equitation fees, stabling fee, and USEF Drug & Admin fee or FEI Drug and Admin fee, Horse Flight Ambulance Fee \$50, Nightwatch fee \$20 per horse per show & a non refundable Office Processing Fee \$100 accompany each entry blank with stabling form. Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to the **Traverse City Horse Shows, LLC** in United States funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed. Mail entries to Great Lakes Equestrian Festival 6535 Bates Road, Williamsburg, MI 49690.

All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form for payment of prize money and a USEF Waiver Release form must be signed in order to enter competitions.

3. ENTRIES & NOMINATIONS

- a) Entries for all hunter and equitation classes close August 19, 2026. Entries after the closing date will be accepted with a late fee of \$100 per horse. Entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion. A post entry late charge of \$40 per class or \$80 per hunter section will apply after the closing date of entries.
- b) Nominations for all noted non FEI Jumper Sections \$275. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$25 unless otherwise stated.
- c) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (see Rule No. 15) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 pm the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes.
- d) Late or improper Grand Prix/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 - \$35,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 will be assessed without exception. In the event of acceptance of a later declaration where Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- e) Horses competing in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- f) NIGHT WATCH: All horses occupying a stall, whether showing or not, are required to pay a one time per show night watch fee of \$20 per show. This service is NOT OPTIONAL. Horses will be checked 6 times each night beginning at 7 pm on Monday through 6 am the following Monday. Please provide emergency contact name and cell phone or hotel room and phone number at your stalls.
- g) Each entry form must give the owner, rider, trainer, and horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider and trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers.
- h) USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$25 per competition (\$10 Drug & Medication, \$15 USEF) (FEI horses \$33 fee) and a \$10 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their USEF/ USHJA membership card to the Competition Secretary. Failure to present a USEF card will result in having to pay non-member fees. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card must be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced.
- i) USEF Eligibility/ USHJA Show Pass Fees:
USEF Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors. Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.
To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing. The eligibility requirement for foreign participants went into effect on September 1, 2023, and under this requirement, foreign participants are no longer permitted to participate in USEF national competitions by merely demonstrating good standing with their own National Federation. A few important notes on this:
 - Those individuals 18 years of age and older must take SafeSport Training to be eligible to participate in USEF national competitions.
 - For those participating in FEI events only, this requirement does not apply.
 - This requirement has been in effect since September 1, 2023, for all foreign com-

petitors except Equestrian Canada competitors.

- j) USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix are subject to USEF International High Performance fee. A \$35 per horse fee will be accessed for each horse on a per class basis.
- k) The responsible party as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- l) If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions; management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on USEF National Horse of The Year points earned from December 1, 2025 to November 30, 2026. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries. Scratches must be done online at Equestrian.Digital
- m) A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.
- n) Non competing horses will be charged a fee of \$150 per week.
- o) All horses are required to wear a back number when leaving the stables and on the competition grounds. Bridle numbers not accepted.

4. SCRATCHES:

- a) Horses entered in hunter sections, jumper or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$125 per jumper or \$100 per hunter. The Office Processing Fee is non refundable. Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary prior to the start of the class or classes being scratched. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition.
- b) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- c) \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the competition, an Official Veterinarian's Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any

5. HONORARY SCORING: The opening and closing of the nomination system will be given at the discretion of Management.

6. COURTESY CIRCLE: Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes in accordance with USEF rules.

7. HORS CONCOURS: No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concurs' during the competition.

8. COMPETITION RING ACCESS: Flatting will be allowed in all rings except the TURTLE CREEK CASINO INTERNATIONAL RING up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the first class. Weather permitting.

9. NUMBERS: Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.

10. ATTIRE:

- a) Appropriate dress is required in all classes.
- b) Formal attire: JUMPERS: Scarlet, dark blue, dark green or black coat; white shirt with white tie, white choker or white stock; white, fawn, or canary breeches, protective

headgear See GR 801, black or brown boots. No exceptions.

- c) Formal attire: HUNTERS: Riders are required to wear scarlet dark coats; white shirts with white stock; white, buff or canary breeches and hunting cap, derby, hunting silk hat, or protective headgear. See GR 801, HU128 and EQ105.1&2
 - d) Jumper riders may wear breeches and solid colored polo shirts unless otherwise noted.
 - e) ALL exhibitors must wear properly fitted protective headgear with a chin strap that passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards while riding on the competition grounds. (USEF GR 801.2)
- 11. AWARD CEREMONIES:**
Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Team competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present will result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class.
- 12. ORDERS OF GO:** Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU 159. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that the necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over three (3) minutes due to conflicts.
- 13. STABLING:**
- a) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC have the right to permit horses to come and go at will. We have elected to do so within certain guidelines upholding our no poing policy.
 - b) Weekly Stalls 10'x10', will be temporary housed under canvas and stall doors will be provided at a fee of \$400 per stall tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries. Permanent National Weekly Stalls (Limited Availability) 10x12 housed under hard cover with doors will be provided at a fee of \$550 per stall tax included for each show and must be reserved by the closing date of entries. FEI stalls 10'x12', - extra tack stalls will be provided at a fee of \$550 per stall tax included for each FEI competition. Stalls must be reserved by the closing date of entries. A charge of \$25 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date of entries.
 - c) **No trailering in or working off trailers will be allowed.**
 - d) Grounds Fee: \$75 will be assessed to horses who are hacking onto the grounds for any reason. Back numbers must be obtained from the show office and worn at all times.
 - e) Initial bedding will not be provided.
 - f) Unless special arrangements are made with management, stalls must be vacated no later than 8:00am the day following the conclusion of each competition.
 - g) STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES
 - h) Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done to their stalls, intentionally or not, and will be charged accordingly.
 - i) Stable flooring is a matted surface.
 - j) Horses are not allowed to share a stall during the competition week. Show accounts may only have a whole stall applied. No splits for the week.
- 14. COURSES:** In all jumper classes, courses may consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, rails, planks, water, liverpool, ditch, wall and panels. In all hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as; brush, wall, in-and-out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, bank and panels.
- 15. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS:** Competition days - Open one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 4:00 pm whichever is later. Non-Competition Day hours will be from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm.
- 16. ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT:** All accounts must be settled in full no later than 4:00 p.m. on the last day of each scheduled competition. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the grounds, a release must be obtained from the Competition Secretary. A late checkout per horse applies after Sunday at 4 PM.
- 17. PRIZE MONEY:**
- a) All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form in order to receive prize money. Prize money will be credited to entry show account. IRS 1099 Miscellaneous Income Forms will be issued to the payee as listed on the entry form.
 - b) Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.
- 18. FEED & BEDDING:** Provided by the 'Official Feed Store' of the Traverse City Horse Shows & Flintfields Entertainment LLC in order to assure exhibitors of an adequate supply of feed based on fair market prices. No other feed vendor other than the Official

Feed Store will be permitted on the grounds without the express permission of the Management. email: feed.glef@gmail.com

19. **DOGS:** All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the show grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.

20. **OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Only "Official and Media" Photographers will be allowed inside the showgrounds and show rings. All media and any one else wishing to take photos or videos must get credentials and permission from show management. Permission must be requested on a week by week basis. www.traversecityhorseshow.com

Any commercial photography or advertisement of such, taken of subjects within the confines and/or boundaries of any show ring without prior written consent from show management is expressly forbidden. (i.e. photo's published on any and all social media who are not of the photo/videoographer's immediate family)

21. **MEDICAL WASTE:** In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors, and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

Any trainer, owner, exhibitor or their agent found improperly disposing of needles or other sharp instruments will be fined \$100.

22. LIABILITY

- a) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC, Morrissey Management Group LLC, Flintfields Horse Park LLC, Flintfields Entertainment, LLC and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at all of the shows listed in this publication.
- b) Traverse City Horse Shows LLC, Morrissey Management Group LLC, Flintfields Horse Park LLC, Flintfields Entertainment, LLC, and their officials and employees will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged packages received / delivered to the show grounds.
- c) "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agent or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."

23. **PARKING PASSES:** All exhibitor vehicles and trailers that enter the grounds are required to have a PARKING PASS. Passes will be provided and are FREE to participants. Parking is allowed in designated areas only. Illegally parked vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

24. MOTORIZED VEHICLES:

Motorized Vehicles that are NOT Street Legal will be allowed on Bates Road.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

25. ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to the Traverse City Horse Shows LLC and Morrissey Management Group, LLC. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose.

At all times for horses competing on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR838 (which de-

fines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR843 (which pertains to Poling), and GR839.4a (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties.

To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing on the Flintfields Horse Park grounds, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed:

26. POLING AND OFF-SETS:

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at the Flintfields Horse Park grounds. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo off-sets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

27. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS:

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to three lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a 24 hour period starting from the time of the incident.

In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited. All incidents will be reported in the Steward's and/or Technical Delegate's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

28. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE: Must be submitted online weekly at Equitrace.

At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

29. **SAFESPORT TRAINING** Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS REGARDING HELMET RULE & ELECTRONIC DEVICE RULES

To All Riders: Please note that the Traverse City Horse Shows would like to reiterate that the mandatory helmet rule that took effect on April 1, 2012, will continue to be enforced this year at the Flintfield Horse Park. The rule has been implemented nationwide at all USEF licensed hunter/jumper competitions.

The rule requires that anyone on horseback on the property wear a helmet at all times. This consists of anyone showing, schooling, or riding horses on and off of the show grounds, including grooms. This is a facility-wide rule.

The Traverse City Horse Shows will be enforcing the rule with the support of the United States Equestrian Federation. This is a zero tolerance policy and must be taken extremely serious as it is for the safety of everyone involved. Anyone on a horse without a helmet will be asked to dismount immediately.

Any insubordination will be penalized and the individuals will be fined and expelled from the property. Helmets must be worn at all times, so please plan accordingly. The Traverse City Horse Show would like to thank everyone for in advance for acting in accordance with the USEF rule GR801 which is stated.

The USEF rule GR801.2 reads:

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

USEF Rule HU106.7.e & JP103.9: The unsafe use of electronic devices, as determined by the competition steward in their sole discretion, including cell phones while mounted is prohibited in all areas designated for schooling and exercise, and while lunging horses on competition grounds. Earphone(s)/Earbud(s) are prohibited in all areas designated for schooling and exercise.

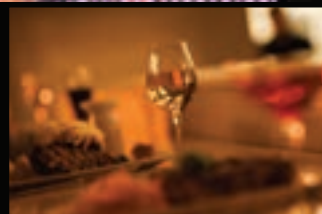

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and TRAVERSE CITY HORSE SHOWS, LLC ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

WARNING:

Under the Michigan equine activity liability act, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in an equine activity resulting from an inherent risk of the equine activity.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D.
